pastor's letter

Thoughts from Pastor Erich ...

Following my sermon drawn from Zechariah 8 on February 19th, Jim Grieser stopped me in the hallway and shared that he had a thought about the scripture. Jim referred to how Zechariah the prophet had worked to encourage the people to restart their work of rebuilding the temple, since their energy and efforts had waned over time, eventually grinding to a halt. Zechariah's message included aspects of hope and promise for the future. Jim thought it would be a good lesson in relationship to our Imagine Your Faith Building Campaign, and I agree with him! And it's a good lesson for many aspects of our ministry and mission.

We cannot let our spiritual fervor wane, but with perseverance and fortitude we must rely upon the words of Paul I quoted in my sermon, from Philippians 3:12-14: "Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already been made perfect, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me. Brothers, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus."

The Season of Lent is upon us, a blessed time of 40 days to press on, taking hold of what Christ intends for us, straining toward the goal of eternal salvation.

I encourage you, as I will myself, to spend more time in prayer in these coming days, praising God and listening for his wisdom, giving energy to strengthening our spiritual faith relationship with Jesus Christ our Lord.

I'm reminded of how Jesus came out of his forty day journey in the desert to face temptation from Satan, and he responded with the power and authority of scripture. Can we be encouraged to read and memorize a new verse or passage each day, or one a week, during Lent? What temptations are we facing? What scripture can we discover that will give us strength to say "no"?

May this Lenten Season be one of encouragement, one of deepening of faith, and one of praising and thanking our Glorious God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

WOW oh wow, has February been busy! I traveled to Texas with my mom during the first weekend, helped host my sister's bridal shower the second weekend, and helped lead our annual women's retreat where over 500 college women came together for worship!

It may have been an exhausting few weeks, but God certainly moved in big ways. The number of women at retreat alone is enough to fill an entire letter! Six of our girls attended "Real Hope for Real Life" where they spent their weekend digging deeper into their identity in Christ. Worship was beautiful, conversations deep, and hope restored. It was an honor watching my girls' hearts open to Jesus a little more with each passing hour.

Another opportunity we had through She Has a Name (an organization fully devoted and passionate about justice and restoration being brought to our world through raising awareness for human trafficking) was to send students to Life Beyond the Streets: a nonprofit in Columbus that lives up to it's name - giving women hope and life beyond prostitution and trafficking. Our students helped assemble "love" bags (hygiene items) to pass out to women living in some of the hardest places in Columbus, and their eyes were opened as they saw firsthand women facing the struggle and intensity of human trafficking. Although painful, God used this experience to give these students more of a heart to serve in this ministry. I'm blessed beyond measure to get to team up with these organizations and provide opportunities for students to get connected with social justice issues in our city. God is restoring and He is using us to play a role in Columbus.

Coming in March we have our spring break trips! Over 200 students are signed up to spend their week with H2O! How cool?! Steve (my husband) and I are helping lead a trip to the Smoky Mountains where we will focus our week on scripture and learning how to connect with God through His Word. Roughly 50 students are signed up to attend.

I cannot believe we are halfway through the semester already, and then another school year will be over! Aside from our trip to the Smokies, Steve and I will make our way to North Carolina for my sister's wedding in March.

I'm incredibly thankful for your generosity, kindness and support. I hope you know how loved you are, and how big of a role you are playing in what God is doing in the next generation. Please feel free to reach out with questions or prayer requests. I love hearing from you!

March Mission-A-Month - Friendship House:



The Friendship House is an Archbold ministry supported by area churches and coordinated by Cecily Rohrs. This two story home, located near downtown Archbold, is set up to house one or two family units at a time. The home provides shelter for individuals and families until they are able to become self-sufficient. The home is almost always occupied and has been a tremendous help to numerous residents. The Friendship House is endorsed by the Archbold Area Ministerial Association and is coordinated by a volunteer board.

The main need of the Friendship House at this point is further financial support for operating expenses. This month we ask that you prayerfully consider supporting this community ministry that strives to care for those in need of a place to stay and have a fresh start in life.

2017 Summer Habitat Mission Trip:

A week has been reserved at Tower Hill Church Camp for June 11-16, 2017. That's the place of lodging for this annual time of service with the LaPorte County Habitat for Humanity. Bob Long, Executive Director of that local HFH affiliate, is looking forward to having a group from SJCC help them start the next build project. Tower Hill is about a two hour trip northwest of Archbold, located in Sawyer, Michigan, while the build sites are located around Michigan City, Indiana – two time zones to contend with!

There is room for up to 13 people to participate in this trip, 14 years of age and older. The group leaves Sunday afternoon, June 11, and arrives at Tower Hill after enjoying dinner along the way. Monday thru Friday, the group eats breakfast in the camp dining hall, then heads to the build site for a day of framing. Work ends late afternoon, when the group heads back to the camp for the evening meal in the dining hall once again, though normally one meal during the week

is enjoyed at a local restaurant. Lunches are provided at the work site. Work ends early afternoon on Friday, with the group returning to Archbold a few hours later.

Habitat for Humanity is designed to equip unskilled volunteers learn various skills, while also welcoming skilled volunteers too. Past participants to talk with include Mike Meyer, Greg Walker, Kelly Ducey, Tammy Nofziger and Duane & Linda Hayes.

Cost of the trip, covering lodging, transportation and most meals is \$125 per person.

Back Bay Mission Trip:

The group returned to Archbold on Friday, February 17th, after spending three days working to restore a home and half a day working at the Back Bay Mission House. The bus trips down and back were uneventful! The group stayed in Cullman, Alabama for a night on the way down, and stayed in Bowling Green, Kentucky on the way home. The trip down was timed perfectly to eat Sunday lunch at "The Shed" - a well-known local barbeque place (The Shed used to have their own cooking reality show, and has been featured on Diners, Drive-ins and Dives!). Then after shopping for groceries at Wal-Mart, the group settled in at the mission house for the week. Mike Meyer soon appeared and we enjoyed spending the week with him – he's doing well and enjoying his volunteer work with all of the groups who've come to work at BBM. Sunday dinner featured boiled shrimp, homemade crab cakes, salad and French bread!

The group shared the mission house with a group from Federated Church of Charlton, Massachusetts for the week. After orientation and safety training on Monday morning, the group drove 20 minutes up the coast to a home in Gulfport. A group the week before had begun the work of gutting the home, having removed all of the flooring, wall drywall and insulation – filling up two dumpsters in the process. Our group filled up two more - with materials from removing three room additions to the home, the ceiling drywall and insulation and damaged framing. After three days of work, most of the termite damaged framing had been replaced and the home was ready for new electrical and plumbing work. Thursday the group made several repairs to the mission house, before heading home shortly after noon.

The week featured good conversation and fellowship, plenty of new stories to laugh about, and friendships were created and deepened.

Craig Steenkamp, the staff person in charge of the home restoration and construction program, is hoping that BBM will be ready to build two new houses come October, counting on SJCC volunteers to frame the walls of the two houses in a week's time! That trip is scheduled for October 7-14.


Consistory Minutes of February 20, 2017:

Meeting opened with devotions by Amy Baden, reading from Hebrews 3:4 and talking about building up our faith. Members shared in a time of getting better acquainted, responding to one of three questions: share favorite Bible Story, share favorite hymn or song, or share favorite place you like to go to and pray. A communion server sign-up for March 1st was passed around and filled out. Minutes of the February Consistory meeting were approved.

Committee Reports included:

- 1. Budget & Stewardship Committee Joyce Kinsman shared that Alex's HSA benefits are being caught up now that his account is in place. Everything seems to be in line. Motion to approve: Dean Sauder and 2nd by Carrie Wooley, reports approved.
- 2. Mission Committee David Stuckey shared the disbursements of FISH Pantry \$1,500, Bluestreak Bags \$1,000, Bethel College (Jeremy Mann) \$500, Total Disbursements \$3,000
- 3. Property Committee Eric Nafziger reported that Betsy Redd has volunteered to coordinate the playground bids. Playground will be kept where it currently sits. Quotes hopefully to come at the next Consistory meeting. Landscape lights outside possible upgrade to LED lights.
- 4. Spiritual Council Pastor Erich reported the council spent time in prayer over the congregation and pastoral concerns. The council reviewed the Elder job description. Reviewed the Ecclesiastical council interview process for Pastor Alex's Ordination. In the process of filling vacant spots on the Pastoral Care Committee. Spent 30 minutes studying scripture as a start of reviewing the process used for electing officers and consistory members in the church.
- 5. Pastor's Report Pastor Erich is working to schedule a Leadership Retreat and will e-mail out potential evenings and poll the Consistory members. Erich shared a report about the sanctuary organ, which needs some expensive repairs. SJCC has a history of maintaining the building. Would removing the organ benefit space issues for the piano and to accommodate praise band? Congregation needs to be aware of the organ issues and why it's not being used currently. Larry Beck has been asked to help provide information about the organ. Consistory will wait to hear from him concerning his ideas about the organ. Chapel Organ hasn't been played in at least 15 years, does it need kept? Owner of the business that sold us that organ is no longer in business, and had no ideas as to how to maintain it today. Pastor Erich will check the memorial notebook as to who it was purchased by, or given by. A request from a neighbor of the church to use the Parish Hall and kitchen for a birthday party for her mother. Not a member, just a neighbor, can she use it? No established cost for use of Parish Hall. \$50.00 rental was approved.
- 6. Associate Pastors Report Pastor Alex is moving forward with Mission Trip. 6 students and 3 adults signed up so far. Initial deposit was sent in.
