Thoughts from Pastor Alex ...

This month is packed full of service for St. John's! The 11th-16th is our mission trip to LaPorte County Habitat for Humanity. The 18th-23rd is the youth mission trip to West Virginia. The 23rd is also the volunteer installation of our new playground. And the 25th-29th is our annual Vacation Bible School.

Will you pause with me to pray for those involved with these trips and projects and to pray for the lives they will touch?

May the joy of the Lord be your strength!


preschool corner

- Explore the connection between Christian faith, service, and social justice through educational sessions with Mission staff as well as through personal and group reflection.
- Learn about poverty on the Mississippi Gulf Coast through service and discussion with Mission staff. You'll also have the chance to explore poverty in your community and think about how you can take what you've learned in Mississippi home.
- Grow in fellowship with the rest of your group by working, eating, and playing together. This is a wonderful opportunity to get to know other people in your congregation in a way you couldn't at home.

A mission trip is an opportunity to do all of this and more without the distractions of home.

Consistory Minutes of May 15, 2017:

- Budget & Stewardship Committee financial reports were approved as presented, with clarification about the computer equipment and computer supplies line items, and the search committee expenses included gifts and meal for Alex's ordination process.
- Capital Campaign Committee Linda Heer is a new member of the committee; Pocket Change Challenge (Memorial Day to Labor Day) is being highlighted again this year; November Celebration Event – planning is underway for the 1st or 2nd Sunday, highlighting past Confirmation classes. Confirmation pictures are currently being sought.
- Christian Preschool Board Treasurer's Balance \$9,347.02. 58 children are enrolled in Preschool currently. 51 students are registered for the 2017-2018 school year. Evaluation forms are being completed. Considering hiring a part-time person (3 ½ hours per week) to help the Teacher's Aide, to allow time for Sue to have administration/planning time.
- Mission Committee recommends discontinuing the Clothing Swap Event due to lack of leadership and mixed reviews of past events; disbursements: \$500 -Agape Family Life House, \$1,000 - Foods Resource Bank, \$500 - Freedom International Ministries (Suon's), \$500 - Habitat for Humanity of Fulton County Ohio (Celebration Event), \$500 - Hands of Grace, \$200 - The Outback, total of \$3,200.00
- Personnel Committee six month review with Pastor Alex scheduled for May 17th.
- Property Committee:
- Playground Update Contract and Check mailed to Game Time – Playground has been ordered, a check has been written. With the ordering process, 3 dates needed to be submitted for dates of installation. Currently June 12th @6PM, the tear out process will begin. Playground should arrive the week of June 19th. Volunteers are needed to help with both tear out and installation.
- Landscape Lights Installation complete, timer system is still not in working order. A member of the Property committee has been attempting to work on the system and is not having any luck. A possible new timer system might be needed to replace the old one.
- Parking Lot Maintenance Complete and Sealed
- Parish Hall AC units Update Last Fall, Property was told the AC Unit in the parish hall needed to be replaced. A local company is coming by this week

- to run a complete check on the units to see if just a service is needed or complete replacement.
- Scholarship Committee disbursed College Scholarships of \$6,000 and \$1,000 of Springer Scholarship.
- Spiritual Council Spent time in prayer over pastoral care concerns and other situations. The nomination and election process was discussed as well. A presentation to Consistory is hoped to be presented at the next Consistory meeting. June 11th at 10:30 service, Kenny and Amanda Walker, Dan Light and Anna Yoder will become new members during this service
- Pastor's Report Sanctuary Organ 1993 annual yearbook article of Dr. Rev. Gary Hodges, very knowledgeable of organs, noted that the organ had not been working properly in years. We need people willing and able to play the organ if we want to invest money into fixing the organ.

Special Congregational Meeting of May 7, 2017:
