Let's Talk About It - This Week in Our Children's and Youth Education:

Pre-K Class: This month we are talking about Joseph: how his colorful coat caused some sibling squabbles; how his brother's lied about his disappearance; how Joseph ended up sharing his grain with his hungry brothers; and how he ends up forgiving them, inspiring many.

Faith Village: Today, we wrapped up the unit entitled "The 10 Commandments". The 10 Commandments help us know how to love and worship God and how to treat others with justice and kindness. They are found in Exodus 20:1–17. The tenth commandment tells us to not want anything that belongs to someone else. God wants us to be content with what we have. Can you name some things that you have that you are thankful for?

Confirmation: Youth went through acolyte training, and then studied the question, "How is the Bible true?" What answers were learned in class? Memory work is Genesis 2:2-3.

Senior High Sunday School: We are continuing our series on the topic of loving God, loving ourselves, and loving others. We discussed how our love for God feeds our love for other people, and why loving our neighbors is an extension of our love for God and love for ourselves. Ask your teens to think of one person who is hurting right now. Encourage them to show love to this person in the coming week.

LOGOS: Preschool/Kindergarten: This week the Logos Preschool/Kindergarten Class talked about Genesis 1:1-8. We puffy painted glow in the dark pictures to represent God's creation of Day and Night. Our chocolate pudding snack (dark) with Reddi Whip (light) also represented the creation of Night and Day. Our blue drink helped us learn about God separating the waters to create the sky!! 3rd Grade: We talked about our favorite Bible heroes. We also talked about how the Bible is God's letter to us and that it is true. 4th Grade: Our discussion centered on each of God's children being different, but yet we all are the same from the stand point that we can communicate (pray) to God at any time and any place.

JYF: 6th, 7th & 8th graders were welcomed to a new year of JYF through some get acquainted activities and worked through some team-building challenges. Devotional was based on 1 Corinthians 12 – many members, one body. Youth are asked to come on 9/20 ready to share their brainstormed thoughts and ideas about the year!

Life Planning: This Wednesday we kicked off Life Planning and we welcomed three new freshmen and their mentors. We talked about the grace of God and how to be a cheerful giver, and how prayer can be a wonderful gift for someone. We also played an icebreaker game similar to the "To Tell the Truth" game show on TV. Our next meeting will be on Oct. 11 @ 7:00PM in the chapel. It's not too late to get involved...if you want to be paired with a mentor, talk with Kim Hines, Karen Walker, or Pastor Alex.

SYF Remix: We enjoyed each other's company, and talked about the new series we're starting for SYF next week. Our lesson will include several student testimonials about temptations students in high school today might face, including sexting and underage drinking, and how students found the courage to stand up for their faith and live for Jesus.

Funds are forwarded to missionaries, agencies and ministries on a monthly, quarterly or annual basis. For example, funds are usually sent to local agencies on a monthly basis, to overseas agencies/missionaries on a quarterly basis (there are transfer fees associated with overseas transactions, so sending quarterly lessens the frequency of those set fees), or annually to seasonal ministries like Operation Christmas Child or Christmas Cheer.
