Membership Orientation

St. John's Christian Church offers periodic orientation sessions to inform people about beliefs, ministries and the history of this local congregation. Mother's Room / Diaper Changing Station / Nursery Care

We have a Mother's Room located near our sanctuary – just ask an usher for its location. A diaper changing station is in our nursery room just down the hallway from our sanctuary. Nursery Care is offered during our 10:30 worship service for infants and pre-kindergarten children.

Hearing Assistance is provided through our loop system for hearing aids with a "t" switch position.

Let's Talk About It - This Week in Our Children's and Youth Education:

Pre-K Class: This morning we talked about David and Goliath. David trusted God. What was the outcome?

Faith Village: Today we continued the unit entitled "Building the Tabernacle," which uses Exodus 25:1–9; 36:1–2; 40:34 as its references. We are learning about the special place for worship that God told the Israelites to construct while they were wandering in the desert. How is the Tabernacle similar to our church building? How is it different?

Confirmation: Lesson was based on Genesis 12:1-9 in looking at God's actions in the world. Key question was "How does God begin a relationship with us?

LOGOS: 2nd Grade: The 2nd grade class is working on memorizing John 3:16. We also talked about John the Baptist. Ask your 2nd grader to tell you something about him. 3rd Grade: The 3rd graders studied Genesis 2-3, learning about the 1st family and the fall bringing sin into the world. We also talked about grabbing onto the promise of hope in Jesus Christ, to allow us back into communion with God. 4th Grade: We discussed five words and how we use them at Sunday worship or in our individual lives. The words were praise, confession, proclamation, petition, and dedication.

JYF: Youth shared in a mixer and a game, each designed to help everyone get better acquainted with each other – who preferred being 9" tall or 9' tall? Who would rather wash the thanksgiving meal dishes or clean a toilet? There were some interesting responses! Youth began to explore the names of the Books of the Bible. Help your youth learn those names!

Sermon – "Faith Alone" by Pastor Alex Young Scripture – Galatians 3:6-14


