October Mission-A-Month – Operation Christmas Child

Let's Talk About It - This Week in Our Children's and Youth Education:

Pre-K Class: This morning we talked about David and Goliath. David trusted God. What was the outcome?

Faith Village: Today we continued the unit entitled, "Building the Tabernacle", which uses Exodus 25:1–9; 36:1–2; 40:34 as its references. We are learning about the special place for worship that God told the Israelites construct while they were wandering in the desert. Can you name some of the items that God told the Israelites to make to put in the Tabernacle?

Confirmation: Today we continued to look at the story of Abraham in Genesis 12, and talked more about how the story of Abraham fits into the story of the whole Bible, and what the story of the Bible means for our lives too. Ask a confirmand you know: what is the story of the Bible?

Senior High Sunday School: Being a teenager is hard. Being a Christian teenager can be harder. In his letter, James acknowledges that we all face situations that require perseverance, and he encourages us to focus on why making God's choices is worth it and how to make those choices.

LOGOS: <u>Preschool/Kindergarten:</u> In continuing our talk of all the wonderful things God made (Genesis 1:1-25), we focused on birds, fish, and animals. We started out the night talking about all the wonderful creatures God made, including our pets at home. We then welcomed Tasha Grieser and her therapy dog, in training, into our classroom. Tasha spoke with the children and educated them on dog safety. She showed us signs to look for and ways we could safely interact with dogs. The children finished the night making animal masks. <u>2nd Grade:</u> This week the 2nd grade class practiced John 3:16. They listened to the story about Jesus reading scripture in the synagogue and what he said afterwards to make them mad. <u>3rd Grade:</u> The 3rd graders studied Genesis 6-9 learning how Noah loved and obeyed God by following God's instructions. We talked about how we could follow God's instructions for our lives.

JYF: A very quick two hours at the Yoder home was enjoyed this past week – hotdogs, devotions, bobbing for apples, group games, s'mores and campfire songs! And we could have been there another hour to get it all in! Praise God the rain held off! Ask your youth what they threw into the fire – what did they hear about not worrying?

SYF: This past week we talked about people in our lives who are good influences and what makes their impact on us and others so positive. How can we be a good influence to others?

Operation Christmas Child (OCC) – OCC is our October Mission-A-Month, and we want to remind you we are using plastic boxes to pack boxes for this mission. Here is a list of items we would like donated or you should pack: Toothbrushes, socks, hats, gloves, dolls (girls only), pencils, pens, notebooks, coloring books (with the least amount of words possible), crayons or colored pencils, pencil sharpener, hairbrush/comb, boxes of band aids, washcloths, bars of soap, hair bows, chapstick, sunglasses, flip flops, and any other toys like puzzles, cars, ect. Please NO food, candy or toothpaste, and refrain from packing or donating stuffed animals or animal related things because they cannot be sent to some countries.


Sermon – "Grace Alone" by Pastor Alex Young Scripture – Ephesians 1:3-8; 2:8-10
