# October Mission-A-Month - Operation Christmas Child

Operation Christmas Child (OCC) is a mission that strives to get needed supplies and The Word of salvation to children living in dire conditions throughout the world. This month, we are collecting items to be included in plastic boxes that will be packed by volunteers here at our church. If you want to pack your own box, please contact the church office and we will provide you with the plastic box(es); otherwise you can put donated items in the white mission box in the Chapel narthex, or give monetary donations using your weekly offering envelope or by dropping off your donation in the church office. Here is a list of items we would like donated or you should pack: Toothbrushes, socks, hats, gloves, dolls (girls only), pencils, pens, notebooks, coloring books (with the least amount of words possible), crayons or colored pencils, pencil sharpener, hairbrush/comb, boxes of band aids, washcloths, bars of soap, hair bows, chapstick, sunglasses, flip flops, and any other toys like puzzles, cars, etc. Please NO food, candy or toothpaste, liquids or lotions, medications or vitamins, breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers, aerosol cans, war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures, and refrain from packing or donating stuffed animals or animal-related things because they cannot be sent to some countries.

## Let's Talk About It - This Week in Our Children's and Youth Education:

**Pre-K Class:** This morning we talked about David and Goliath. David trusted God. Ask your child what they learned about David trusting God.

Faith Village: We continued the unit entitled "Joshua Leads the People" which uses parts of Joshua 1; 3; 4; 6 as its references. After Moses died, God chose Joshua to lead the Israelites across the Jordan River into the Promised Land. God told Joshua to be strong and courageous because God would be with him wherever he would go. How can you be strong and courageous at home or school, knowing God is also with you wherever you go?

**Confirmation:** In a second lesson from the book of Exodus, the study was on Exodus 7–11 and the ten plagues in which the focus was on how God liberated his people. Can you name the ten plagues? How does God give us freedom today?

**Senior High Sunday School:** We read from Daniel 3:1-18 and then discussed that there will be times we are tempted and even asked to violate what we believe. The big question is "How do we make a stand for what is right?"

LOGOS: Preschool/Kindergarten: This week we talked about 1 Corinthians 12:12-31 and focused on our sense of hearing. With our amazing ears, we identified loud and soft sounds and created different kinds of animal sounds. And because owls make such interesting sounds we made an owl craft and had an owl snack. 1st & 2nd Grades: The 1st and 2nd grades talked about the story of how Jesus fed the 5,000. 3rd Grade: We learned in Genesis how Jacob did everything he could to receive the birthright and the blessing. Do we realize our birthright through Jesus Christ and do everything we can do to receive his blessing? 4th Grade: The fourth graders looked at ways God has made their lives better.

JYF: Steve Walker shared a devotional about endurance and running, using cross country running as an illustration of running the race marked out for us (Hebrews 12:1). Following a fun and insightful game of "Two Truths and a Lie," the youth prepared for their Poinsettia and Wreath Sale.

**SYF:** We went to hear Michael Franzese "Prince of the Mafia" at Founder's Hall share his testimony about how he went from being "The Godfather" to living for God THE Father.


