Sermon Notes:

Let's Talk About It - This Week in Our Children's and Youth Education:

Pre-K Class: The Preschoolers are using the story of Daniel to talk about how God watches over us when we are away from home, when we are at school, and when we are scared. In fact, he watches over us ALL the time.

Faith Village: We finished up the unit entitled "Joshua Leads the People" which uses parts of Joshua 1; 3; 4; and 6 as its references. After Moses died, God chose Joshua to lead the Israelites across the Jordan River into the Promised Land. Joshua showed his faith in God by being obedient to God. How can you show your faith and obedience to God at home or school?

Confirmation: We continued to look at the story of the Bible from the Exodus to Mount Sinai and the Ten Commandments, where God and his people covenant loyalty to each other forever, and where God calls the people he has saved to live according to his wisdom and love so that they might most fully enjoy their lives and be a blessing to others. Have you memorized the Ten Commandments? Try it this week!

Senior High Sunday School: We are all called to do God's work or missions. This Sunday we had a speaker show a video and discuss missionary work. How can you do mission work right here in Northwest Ohio? It may be as simple as helping a friend(s) through a tough time. May you hear God's voice this week!

LOGOS: <u>1st & 2nd Grades:</u> This week the 1st and 2nd grades learned about Zaccheus and made welcoming door hangers.

JYF: The youth welcomed special guests, Tammy Nofziger, Mandy Gonzales and Mary Jo Bray. Mandy and Mary Jo work with Sunshine, and Mandy is the supervisor of the group home located next door to the church. Learning about the home and the people who live there is in preparation for youth to visit and become friends with the residents.

SYF: Last week, SYF and Life Planning teamed up to pack 120 boxes for Operation Christmas Child to spread the Good News of Jesus' love all around the world. We pray, Lord Jesus, that one day every tongue will confess you as Lord! Students, come ready to use your voices to praise Jesus through song at SYF this week!



Funds are forwarded to missionaries, agencies and ministries on a monthly, quarterly or annual basis. For example, funds are usually sent to local agencies on a monthly basis, to overseas agencies/missionaries on a quarterly basis, or annually to seasonal ministries like Operation Christmas Child or Christmas Cheer. There are transfer fees associated with overseas transactions, so sending quarterly lessens the frequency of those set fees.
