# pastor's letter

#### Thoughts from Pastor Alex ... Terrestrial and Cosmic Aspects of Advent

In Victorious, his devotional guide on the book of Revelation, Matt Proctor tells the story of how his family prepared for Advent a little differently one year. It started in the usual way, with the setting out of their nativity set, complete with serene figurines of baby Jesus and his earthly family. When we prepare for the Advent season, we normally think of this terrestrial scene, described in Matthew 2 or Luke 2. But this particular year, Proctor decided to explore with his family the cosmic aspect of the nativity, as described in Revelation 12.

In this passage, the Apostle John borrows the language of the myth of Apollo (which his readers were quite familiar with) to tell them the story of Jesus. According to mythology, Apollo was born into the world with a dragon poised to snatch him from his mother's womb, but was saved at the last moment, so that he could later return to defeat the dragon. In the same way, John writes, Jesus was born into the world with Satan desiring to destroy him, but Jesus was taken up into heaven...and as the story of Revelation unfolds, we read of heavenly warfare and of the decisive defeat of Satan. And so, in order to illustrate the cosmic aspect of Advent to his family, Proctor added a gleaming, red dragon to his nativity set.

Christmas is not just about a child being born who would one day be a good teacher and be an inspiration for other people to be polite and courteous. It's about the birth of a King who would be the Hero of the World, who would face all the forces of evil, visible and invisible, and conquer evil once and for all for the sake of his people. And being a Christian isn't just about dressing up in nice clothes and sitting in pews to listen to sermons at church. It's about being dressed up in the armor of God and resisting the attacks of the Evil One (Eph. 6) and doing the work of God's kingdom. Notice that in Revelation 12, when the dragon who symbolizes Satan fails to have baby Jesus for a snack, he turns his effort to Jesus' brothers and sisters...the church! Satan desires to destroy you. But alongside Almighty Jesus, not even death can separate you from God. Rather, as you follow Jesus in life and in death, you will also follow him into resurrection life and into glory. The message of Proctor's devotion (and the message of Revelation) is that we who stay faithful to Jesus, in the end will be victorious. Death will be defeated, and we will live with God forever: our King, our Hero, and our Friend.

Let the words of Revelation 12 be a reminder to us of the cosmic significance of Advent. There is a battle raging on between good and evil. Our Hero has come. And all who rally to Him will be saved. First, therefore, let us come to Him and be saved. Second, let us put on the protection He offers us for life on the battlefield (Eph. 6). Third, let us set our hands to the work of the battlefield: saving others. As Jesus' half-brother exhorts us in Jude 23: "Snatch others from the fire and save them." Revelation 12 reminds us: there's more to life than we can see right now. Live (by faith) according to these invisible realities, not just according to what we can see. Giving allegiance to God, resisting the pleasures of evil, working to save others...it will all be worth it! And one day we'll see. Right now, we have only God's promises that it will be worth it, like packages wrapped up under a tree. But one day the packages will be opened, and we'll have not just the promise, but the reward.

Jesus is coming . . .



### preschool corner

At the beginning of the month, we completed our "Fall" theme, and moved on to "Dinosaurs." This theme is definitely a favorite among the children, and the teachers always learn one or two things about dinosaurs that we didn't know! We talked about meat eaters and plant eaters, and how to tell which dinosaurs fit into each category. The older children constructed and decorated dinosaurs from paper plates, while the younger ones used fabric to glue spikes on their stegosauruses. We then named each dinosaur (for example, Kenleyosaurus, Laineyosaurus, etc.). The children then learned about "Thanksgiving," completing various turkey crafts. The older children did a turkey worksheet about number order, and they sang, "Turkey in the Straw." The children painted pictures at the easel and told what they were thankful for. They learned about the Indians and Pilgrims, and how the first Thanksgiving differed from ours today. The last week of the month we explored the "5

Senses" God gave us to experience the world He created. The older children played a fun game of "Sound Bingo" at the game table, where they had to guess the sound on a CD. The children played with colored cooked spaghetti and scissors in the sensory table, shaving cream in the art area, and had to guess what was in the "mystery box" by feeling with their hands.

#### **December Mission-A-Month – Crossroad Child & Family Services:**

For more than 134 years, Crossroad Child & Family Services in Fort Wayne, Indiana, has focused on the needs of children and families who have few alternatives. Founded as an orphanage in 1883 by the

German Reformed Church in the United States, their faithbased mission to children with the greatest need has remained.

Today, they work with emotionally troubled children other providers have chosen not to work with, or have failed

to help. These children may also be mentally retarded/ developmentally disabled, autistic and/or experiencing the results of brain trauma, have parents with substance abuse problems and/or have experienced sexual abuse. In their residential and education services, these children are as young as age six. Much too often they are children who have been hurt the worst by those who should have protected them the most.

Their needs for therapy, education, and family support services are complicated and challenging. Yet, Crossroad's outcomes are extremely good! Crossroad provides services in their school "Crossroad Academy", and in residential, outpatient, and community based services. In October they opened an emergency shelter care program for girls with mental health issues. Crossroad will serve nearly 400 youth this year.

Today, the growing adult opioid epidemic (heroin/ prescription drug addiction) and trafficking trends has led to a growing number of children needing therapeutic help; there are more children on Crossroad's waiting list for services than their total number of beds. The need is growing and Crossroad needs resources to help more children!

Check out the mission bulletin board right outside the church office for a Wish List of current needs from Crossroad. Any items you provide from this list can be placed in the white mission box outside the Chapel narthex.

Your prayers and generous financial and in-kind support truly does help change the futures of young people, and the Crossroad Board of Directors and staff send their thanks for our partnership in helping these vulnerable children that has spanned more than 134 years!

#### **Confirmation:**

In our journey through the story of the Bible, we've come to the Ten Commandments, where after saving His people from Egypt, the Lord gives His people instructions on how to live life to the fullest in His kingdom. We've also been looking at the Heidelberg Catechism (a document written in 1563 that helped serve as a theological foundation for our congregation) which serves as a guide to better understand the faith. For example, about the 8th Commandment ("Thou shall not steal"), the catechism elaborates (with Scriptural proofs) that through this command, God prohibits not just outright theft, but also all methods of dishonest gain, and the greed which drives these immoral and unjust practices. Furthermore, the catechism explains that the 8th Commandment teaches us that we are to treat our neighbors as we would like to be treated (dealing with them with honesty and even generosity), and that we should work hard to meet our needs and to enable us to be generous to our neighbors (as we would want them to be toward us).

#### **Consistory's Work of Congregational Visioning:**

The three working groups of the Consistory will spend the time between the November and December meetings focused on creating action steps to address three of the five goals.

The committee continues to organize interesting stewardship presentations as part of the monthly second offerings towards the campaign. Their work of planning for the future involves discerning additional ways to educate the congregation regarding stewardship, sacrificial giving and tithing.
