## Let's Talk About It - This Week in Our Children's and Youth Education:

**Pre-K Class:** We are continuing to learn more and more about the real reason for Christmas. What super cool thing happened during Christmas time?

**Faith Village:** We began a new unit today entitled "Journey to Bethlehem" which uses Luke 2:1-21 and Micah 5:2-5a as its references. People in Bible times waited with anticipation for the coming of the Savior. During Advent, we wait and prepare to celebrate the birth of the promised Savior, Jesus. What is your favorite part of the Christmas story?

**Confirmation:** Over the next two weeks the Confirmands are practicing parts to help bring the nativity scene to life for Faith Village. Put yourself in the sandals of Mary, or Joseph, or the Shepherds. What would you be feeling in light of the events and promises surrounding the nativity? What would help you continue to trust God as Joseph and Mary did?

Senior High Sunday School: As children, you get to follow along in the traditions your parents have set for the family. Hopefully your family has traditions that have helped you learn the meaning of the season and have enabled your family to glorify God together. What traditions does your family have that enables you to do this? Share with another teen or parent. Now, as teens, you may have the ability to help shape your family's traditions. What would you like to add to your family's routine to bring honor to Christ? Perhaps reading together as a family the story of the Nativity in the Gospel of Luke? Perhaps singing some Christmas hymns together around the family piano, or with youtube playing the songs in the background? This Christmas, find a way to honor Christ our King, our Lord, and our Love!

**SYF:** This week we enjoyed a Christmas-themed game night, playing Christmas charades, Christmas trivia, and we had a Santa's beard contest, and sang Christmas songs too!

## Sermon – "The Light of the World" Scripture Text – Luke 1:39-45, 46-55 (p. 1013)

Matthew 18:3 And he said: "I tell you the truth, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven."

Come to the celebration of Christ's birth as a child...

Ask a child what they think when they see a nativity scene.

What does a child do with a nativity scene?

What does the nativity scene represent?

Narrative. Story. Ritual. Visual. Touch. Repetition. Familiar.

#### Luke 1:39-45 - Mary's Visit with Elizabeth

- What's known?
  - o Birth of John the Baptist foretold
  - o Birth of Jesus foretold
  - o In the sixth month, God sent the angel Gabriel
  - o Mary visited Elizabeth relatives
  - o Mary stayed with Elizabeth for three months
- Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit enlightened by the Spirit
- Mother of my Lord knowing Jesus would be her Lord
- Blessed happy situation of those God favors Mary's response of faithfulness (v. 38)

#### Mary's Song - The Magnificat

- Similar to/Drawn from Hannah's Prayer of 1 Samuel 2:1-10
- Imagery speaks of Mary's awareness of Old Testament scripture
- 1. (46-49) Praise God for what he has done for Mary
  - o Tell out, Enlarge the Greatness of God; My soul glorifies the Lord
  - o God my Savior only sinners need a Savior
  - o My spirit rejoices sing praise, worship, glorify the Lord
  - o Mighty One whose great power has been exercised in Mary's life
- 2. (49-50) Attributes of God power, holiness, mercy
  - o His mercy extends to those who fear him a pious reverence
- 3. (51-53) God's sovereign action in reversing social conditions
  - o He has filled the hungry
  - o Sent the rich away
- 4. (54-55) God's mercy in Israel


#### This Week's Congregational Prayer:

# December Mission-A-Month - Crossroad

Crossroad Child & Family Services was founded in 1883 as an orphanage by the German Reformed Church in the United States (one of the predecessor denominations to the UCC). They were founded as the Reformed Orphan's Home of Fort Wayne, Indiana to care for the "neediest of God's children." Ohio churches were very involved in the creation of the organization "way out in the Western Synod of the church" in Fort Wayne, Indiana! Crossroad has been supported by the predecessor churches to the UCC and the United Church of Christ throughout their nearly 133-year history.

Over the years their name changed and their services evolved as the needs of children changed. Today's Mission: "Crossroad creates promising futures for children in difficult circumstances by providing therapy, education and family support services." Crossroad is known throughout the Midwest as one of the largest providers of treatment for troubled children and their families.
