Sermon Series – Saying No to Sin Sermon – "Leaving Sin Behind" Scripture – John 8:1-11

Biblical Scholarship

- John 7:53-8:1 often footnoted
- Most likely not a part of the original text
- Absent from oldest copies of the Gospel that precede the sixth century
- Preserved from a very early time accords well with the known character of Jesus

Temple Courts

- People gathered
- Jesus teaching
- Opposition teachers of the law, Pharisees; trying to trap him for accusation
 - o Created an apparently impossible dilemma for him
- An example
 - o Person caught in sin; woman caught in adultery
 - o Jesus did not challenge the charge
 - o Law of Moses stoning Leviticus 20:10, Deuteronomy 22:22-24
 - o Now what do you say?
- Dilemma
 - o If Jesus refused to confirm the death penalty, charged with contradicting God's law
 - o If he confirmed the verdict, he would lose his reputation for compassion
- Response
 - o Writing...what?
 - o Jesus says, "If any one of you is without sin...(put the dilemma back on them)
 - * A witness of the accusation must commence the stoning
 - * A witness of adultery would have been unusual, done in private; if there was a witness, then they condoned the act, or created it to trap Jesus
 - Those who heard began to go away one at a time Unwilling to admit their presence at the act, or aware of their own sin
 - o Jesus told her, "Go now and leave your life of sin."
 - * Interested in saving rather than exploiting
 - * Forgiving rather than condemning

Today

- Jesus commands us to leave our life of sin
- Must be able to recognize sinful behavior
- Scripture points out sin, yet much is condoned or approved

Let's Talk About It - This Week in Our Children's and Youth Education:

Faith Village: We finished the unit today entitled "Anger Management", which used the story of Nabal, Abigail, and David, found in 1 Samuel 25:2-35, to teach us positive ways to deal with anger. What are some of the ways we have learned to help relieve our angry feelings?

Confirmation: We're turning from the Old Testament to the New Testament, starting with Matthew 1. What's new about the New Testament, you might ask? It has the same old God, with the same old way of salvation (by God's grace). So what's new? In a word: Jesus. What's new is that God takes on flesh and comes to dwell among his people so that they might come to know him better and come to know his love for them.

Senior High Sunday School: We're making subs to raise money for our Chicago mission trip. Do you know mission trips cost hundreds of dollars per person? Despite their expense, in the past these trips have been formative experiences for our teens. Take Leah Miller for example. She began coming to St. John's when invited by a friend to JYF. Through being a part of this church, especially her experience on the past two SYF mission trips, Leah's faith has grown to the point where she decided to be baptized this past year. Stop by after church to see if there are any extra subs left, or leave a donation if you want to help enable the teens to have these faith-building opportunities. Thank you for your support!

LOGOS: <u>First Grade</u>: They have been reading and discussing stories about Jesus. Last week, we learned about Jesus calling his first disciples, Simon Peter, Andrew, James and John. This week, we learned about Jesus' visit to the home of Mary and Martha. <u>3rd Grade</u>: We studied Deuteronomy 5 and how Moses explained the Ten Commandments to the next generation of Israelites before entering the Promised Land. We discussed how the Ten Commandments are laws of love, love God and love others.

JYF: JYF studied the four gospel accounts of the Feeding of the 5000. Why did Jesus want his disciples to care for the hungry crowd? What does that teach us about how we are to care for others? JYF is making plans to host an upcoming community meal – wonder how many they'll feed?

SYF: We looked at Luke 15 and Jesus' series of 3 parables: the lost sheep, the lost coin, and the lost son. Jesus' point is that we are not to look down on "sinners" as others might do, but we are to spend energy trying to help bring them back home, back to God's family, back where they are loved, back where they belong. And as such "sinners" take small steps toward home, let us not chastise their past, but encourage their progress and receive them with open arms.

Out of Box Experience

With the Archbold FISH Food Pantry as our February Mission-A-Month, we are offering the "Out of Box Experience" once again! People are invited to gather in the chapel at 3PM on Sunday, February 18th to begin this mission adventure. Individuals, couples, families, children, youth and adults – all are welcome! We'll divide into shopping groups, then head out to the stores to shop for items for the pantry. After shopping, everyone will meet at the pantry to learn how it operates and we'll stock the shelves with the items just purchased. It's a mission/fellowship experience all rolled into one event!
