Let's Talk About It - This Week in Our Children's and Youth Education:

Pre-K Class: This Week the Preschool/Kindergarten class retold the story of Jesus birth (Matthew 1& Luke 1-2) using finger puppets. The students then made a bracelet with beads representing events in the nativity story. To close the evening, the kids ate heart shaped snacks to remind them of the love Mary had for her son and that each one of us is dearly loved by Jesus.

Faith Village: We continued the unit entitled, "Mary of Bethany Anoints Jesus". The story is found in John 12:1-8. Mary offered an expensive gift to Jesus, but the cost of the gift was not what was important. What was important was that Jesus wanted to do something kind for Jesus. What gifts do you have that you can use to help someone else?

Confirmation: We continue to talk about the life of Jesus. Parents, talk with your students about John 1:18. What does it mean that Jesus makes God the Father known to us?

Senior High Sunday School: This week we concluded our series on Old Testament heroines by looking at the story of Esther, the Hebrew girl who became Queen of Persia. Esther is a biblical Cinderella, having been raised by her older cousin as they lived in the Jewish community that remained behind after the end of the Jews' captivity. Those who stayed did so to continue the successful lives and businesses they'd built, but they were certainly religious and ethnic minorities among the people King Xerxes ruled in the Persian Empire.

LOGOS: The First graders continue to learn how to look up verses in the Bible. This week we looked up, read and discussed Jesus telling the parable of the lost sheep, Luke 15. We then looked for hidden sheep in our classroom and worked on a hidden picture page.

SYF: This week at SYF we had a time of worship, prayer, and enjoyed a night of fellowship and games together.

Parenting is Hard...Let Us Help!


There will be a series of 3 educational parenting presentations held here at St. John's Christian Church presented by HC3 (Healthy Choices, Caring Communities).
