#### **Back Bay Mission Trip**

The mission trip program at Back Bay Mission (BBM) is focused on serving the poor and marginalized of the Mississippi Gulf Coast. But they are also focused on making our time with them an opportunity for faith formation and learning. Among other things, groups will have the opportunity to learn about poverty on the Mississippi Gulf Coast (and in our own community). Back Bay Mission believes that providing these experiences is a benefit for participants, their congregations and communities, and the people of the Mississippi Gulf Coast.

The volunteer program at Back Bay Mission isn't just about serving the poor and marginalized. It's also about serving their volunteers! This is an opportunity for work campers to learn and grow while serving others. Goals of their program include:

- 1. Demonstrating living out the Christian faith by meeting the immediate needs of the people we serve and helping them grow towards long term sustainability.
- 2. Providing opportunities for increased self-understanding and personal growth for all participants.
- 3. Exposing participants to cultural patterns and value systems that may differ from their own, and provide an opportunity for dialogue about that experience.
- 4. Helping participants understand the ministry and commitments of Back Bay Mission.
- 5. Providing opportunities for meaningful service to others.

This year's fall trip will be the 38th work experience with BBM since 2000. There is a core group of people who have been able to attend most of the past 30 trips, providing good experience to orient new folks to these experiences. The work can either be new construction or home renovation work – that's decided by the BBM staff, and our volunteers show up with a "can-do" attitude!

A team of 12 youth and adult chaperones (Ryan Christman, Darby Stevens, Alex Young, and Devin Beltz, Emily Hines, Leah Miller, David Richardson, Joshua Richardson, Yohanna Richardson, Callie Rohrs, Kylie Sauder, and Kelsey Wyse) traveled to Chicago to serve with Living Hope Church on June 4-10. We worked hard cleaning up the adjacent lot, so that neighboring kids could have a place to play during the church's summer camp registration event. We also helped the church get ready for this event, by painting posters with superhero logos. Their 6 week camp, which began 6/25, will look at a different superhero each week and study how these heroes exemplify the fruit of the Spirit. We also did various other projects at the church and in the community, such as helping move a lady's furniture, and helping reclaim a community garden from a jungle of weeds.

In addition to our labor, we learned a lot from our conversations with the ministry staff members about life in Chicago, racism and poverty, and how Living Hope was making a difference in the lives of their neighbors. Darby Stevens, who is working with a ministry (CSM) in Chicago this summer, also took us on a driving tour of the city, on which she shared about some of the city's problems and some of the ministries making a difference, and lead us to pray over these various institutions (schools, hospitals, jails), and about other issues (gang-related violence, racism, gentrification).

Thank you for your financial support of this church and its ministries, which made this trip possible for our students. And thank you for your prayers for our students, both as they were away serving, and now as they continue to reflect on their experience and think how they might each serve God with their lives. # consistory/committees

#### **2018 Discernment Team**

The Consistory of the Congregation has approved the recommendation to form a Discernment Team for the purpose of seeking God's guidance in the efforts of discernment as a ten year plan of ministry is envisioned and formulated to produce both short term and long term directions for the full range of ministries of St. John's Christian Church, including past and current ministries, and any discerned new ministries.

The team will pray for and seek the Lord's leading through the study of scripture, the exploration of church planning resources, gathered information from the congregation and other churches, and through the use of available resources.

This Discernment Team will consist of ten to fourteen people, including the two pastors and a representative of Consistory. The expressed desire is to have one to three people from up to seven age groups of the congregation. The team will begin their work of discernment as soon as Pastor Erich is able to recruit the team members, who will come from a recommended list of people approved by the Consistory.

If this process of planning and discernment is of interest to you, please speak with Pastor Erich.

### **Community Meal Ministry:**

The meals are returning to SJCC for the months of July, August and September. These meals are a community minded ministry that strives to



connect people, be a Christian witness of God's love, and witness to the unity of local churches serving in partnership with each other. Any community member/family who desires assistance with food OR who longs for fellowship and conversation OR who doesn't feel like cooking on any given night OR who simply wants to come and eat with people of the community are invited to these meals.


