July Mission-A-Month – Shepherd's Circle

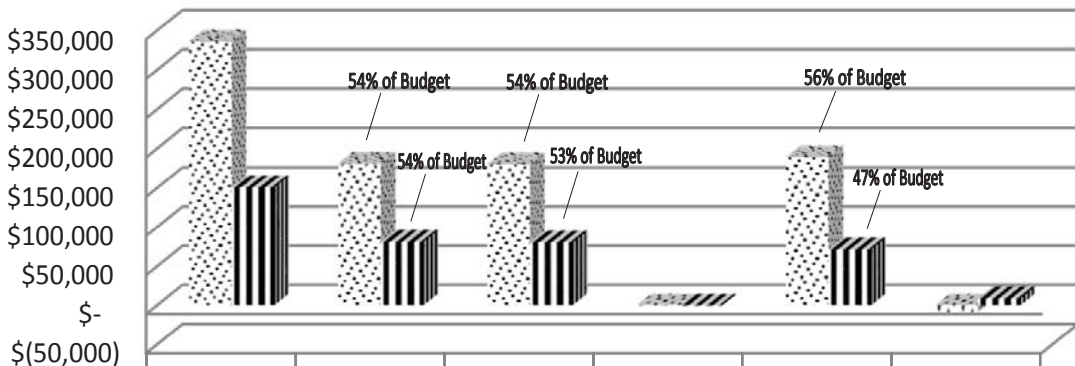

Sermon – “Community Discipline”

Scripture – 1 Corinthians 5:1-13

The Situation

- Person in the church fails to live the life of holiness to which Christ’s followers are to live
- Not all the particulars are known, or need to be known
- A man within the Corinthian church is living in sexual immorality
- Christian community is ignoring the situation; might be focused on their own spirituality

Paul’s Response

- Paul’s focus is on the health and integrity of the church as a corporate body
- Sinful behavior of an individual in the church affects the corporate body
- Disciplinary action must be taken – expel the sinner from the church
- Condemns the sinner, scolds the community for ignoring or not dealing with the situation
- Calls for the expulsion of the man from the Corinthian church

Yeast/Leaven

- Often used illustration – Matthew 16:6, 11-12, Mark 8:15, Luke 12:1, Galatians 5:9
- Explains Paul’s directive – allowing the man to remain in the church will contaminate the whole community
- The Passover lamb (Exodus) – setting Israel a part as a distinct people of God
- Christ, the Passover lamb – sets Christ’s followers a part as a distinct community

Points of Thought

- A difficult passage – the Revised Common Lectionary leaves out most of this passage
- The church is to oversee the holiness of the community – a corporate responsibility
- This is not a directive to disassociate with people of the world
- All in Christ’s church are bound closely together, shared responsibility for each other

Freedom Campus – Dominican Republic

Their Mission – Freedom equips people to engage culture according to their design.

Their Vision – Freedom develops life-changing relationships with those most unlikely so that they become catalysts for change in the Dominican Republic.

Freedom has started a bilingual, Christian school near the town of Ramón Santana. Over one hundred sugarcane villages are found in the surrounding area. The school serves families of Ramón Santana and the nearby bateyes (villages around a sugar mill). There were 240 students enrolled in seven levels for the 2017-2018 school year. Each year, another grade level will be added. The final goal is for the school to grow to 1,800 students.

The school is a tool for discipleship. Through 18,000 hours of contact time between pre-school and high school graduation, they are praying that lives will be changed. They specifically want to train students to glorify God in 3 areas: by walking in relationship with the Lord, developing wholesome relationships with others, and using their God-given uniqueness to live for Him.

As a congregation, St. John's began partnering in ministry with the Suon's in January of 2017. Jason & Becky, and their four young children, Finley, Paisley, Stacia and Moses, moved from their home north of Wauseon and arrived in the Dominican Republic on January 23, 2017.

Jason is involved in construction and maintenance on the mission's campus, and Becky teaches in the school's preschool program. As extensions of their work on the campus, they are often in the bateyes visiting with parents and families of the students and co-workers. These visits provide great opportunities of getting to know people and sharing the love and gospel of Christ.
