### pastor's letter

Even as we savor the final weeks of summer, our ministry volunteers are finalizing preparations for the new school year. As part of our preparations, our youth leaders are reading the book: Don't Waste Your Life by John Piper. The book opens with the story of a man who comes to faith in Jesus later in life, under the preaching of Piper's father. In tears, this older man mourned his misspent life: "I've wasted it! I've wasted it!" This image made a lasting impression on Piper, leading him to ask: "How does one live well?" The answer to that question is the subject of Piper's book.

A similar image has also left a lasting impression on me. On the youth mission trip this summer, we met an older man from the church who quickly grew to love our group to the extent that he became quite protective of us. From his own past, he's learned that our own bad choices can be our worst enemy, and he urged our youth to live their lives in keeping with the will of God. It really was quite touching to see how intensely he cared for us in knowing us such a short time and how earnestly he urged us to follow God.

Don't wait until the end of your life to think about how you should be living your life. Or as some coaches will put it: "If you fail to plan, you plan to fail." Yes, Jesus can and will save you even at the end. But what if there's more to life than being saved? What if being saved is just the beginning? What if we can live our lives in a way that is full of meaning and joy? We can, if we live our lives for God. Consider reading Piper's book this month if you've ever wondered how to get the most out of life.

#### **Pastor Erich's Back Surgery**

Pastor Erich will undergo surgery on the lumbar region of his back on August 22nd. There was no injury that caused the issues he's dealing with, but it's the degeneration of three disks and four vertebrae that are impacting various nerve roots and nerves that will be addressed by the surgery. The surgery will be performed at St. Luke's Hospital in Maumee. Following the lengthy procedure he could be in the hospital for the better part of a week. Naturally, there will be a lengthy time of recovery. The plan is for him to be off of work through September 16th, and then he hopes to begin both physical therapy and start working half days that week. The fusion should heal in six months and he should be back to "normal" duty in a year's time.

Pastor Erich is working to make the most of the weeks leading up to the surgery, coordinating the many aspects of ministry with Pastor Alex, the Spiritual Council and Consistory so everything will be covered in his absence.

He will be kept informed of all pastoral care situations and be available to Pastor Alex and Kelly Stahl for administrative assistance following the first few days after surgery.

Pastor Erich remains grateful of the prayers that are and will be lifted up for him!

#### 2018 Discernment Team

The Consistory of the Congregation has approved the recommendation to form a Discernment Team for the purpose of seeking God's guidance in the efforts of discernment as a ten year plan of ministry is envisioned and formulated to produce both short term and long term directions for the full range of ministries of St. John's Christian Church, including past and current ministries, and any discerned new ministries.

To date, ten people of the congregation have agreed to serve on the team, joining the pastors in this exciting endeavor. The intent is to have an initial start-up meeting the week of August 13th, and then the team will really get engaged in the process following Pastor Erich's return in late September. July Consistory Meeting Highlights

- Financial Reports Joyce Kinsman reported that the Annual Operating Budget is running at negative balance, but there is a strong cash balance on hand. Capital Improvement Budget has half the budget left, at the midpoint of the year. There is power in compounding – for instance, in the Imagine Our Faith Building campaign, the congregation has donated over \$600,000, but with our investments we have over \$688,000, so there is growth. We feel we are in compliance and in line with our investments. The Consistory designated group will meet with Engler, Garrow and Roth, our investment advisors, every 6 months, in place of every 12 months, which would be a revision of the Investment Strategy Policy. Motion to approve the financials as well as a revision to the policy – motion to approve, Jeff Rutledge, 2nd the motion, Greg Walker. Motion approved.
- Evangelism Committee Alex Young Committee met this past week and are finalizing plans for the BBB (Book Bag Bash). They are sewing prayer pillows to be given away to students that come through for the BBB. The Evangelism Committee survey sent out has only received 5 responses so far.
- Farm Operations Committee Eric Nafziger reported that Rod Kinsman is the new Committee Chairperson.
- Mission Committee Betsy Ducey reported that Tom Hines is now serving on Mission Committee. Talk of resuming Mission Band is in the works. July Disbursements included: Aroles \$500, Hands of Grace \$500, Mighty in the Land \$500, Sparrow's Nest \$500, TGRM \$500, for a total of \$2,500. The committee heard a presentation from Kinsey Smith, who will be serving through Cru in Thailand, teaching at an international school, committee used \$1,500 from the Urgent Mission Outreach fund to support her this year.
- Preschool Board Ann Fether reported that evaluations with Sue and Joan will be on July 23rd @ 6:30 to go over their yearly review. The board would like more input as to how the year goes to help with support.

- Property Committee Dean Sauder update the Consistory on the bus, which is having the floor replaced. Erich shared that the first floor classroom space has/is being arranged for use by the Women's class downstairs during the summer months. The preschool room will be "shared" during the school year. Time was taken as a group to go into the bell tower addressing the metal structures, and its' been decided that something needs to be done, for if we don't do anything now it will only continue to deteriorate more. \$11,300 to scrape the metal down and paint, \$17,180 to repair the bells. Freight could be an additional charge. Ideas would be to repair the bells and then to scrape and repaint with industrial enamel paint. Plans are in the making to discuss some landscaping updates. Property committee will come to August's Consistory meeting with a proposal for tower maintenance, bell maintenance and a landscaping quote to finalize plans for a Congregational meeting to seek approval of the repairs.
- Spiritual Council discussed coverage needs during the time of pending surgery and recovery for Pastor Erich. Directory of Music Ministry, Andrew Rohrs, has started his position and is learning the new position. The pipe organ had a meltdown during a recent service, Larry Beck will be a guest organist on August 5th, hoping to hear from him some more about the status of the organ. Christian Education Team will have their first meeting in over two years, to begin planning for the coming program year.
- Pastor's Report Surgery and Rehab Pastoral Coverage – Timeline for surgery and recovery time was given to Spiritual Council as well as Consistory. The church had earlier opted not to pay for short term disability insurance, as the church will cover anything short term in nature. Long term begins after 90 days. There will be two Sunday's 9/2 and 9/9 both pastors will be absent. Elders will assist in leading, and we are looking for someone to speak on each of those Sunday's. The Elders will be taking care of pastoral care during that week, as well. Surgery is scheduled for August 22nd. On the day of surgery and during his hospital stay, Erich is requesting no visitors due to the extensive nature of the surgery, and Lynne will do her best to keep the church office updated on his progress!

•2018 Discernment Team - Trying to populate the team with members. Looking for 12-14 members, currently 8 are committed. Pastor Erich is recommending that this team won't begin until the end of September, after his return from surgery. •Online Giving – American Church, Church Teams, and Giving Tools are three software companies being considered. F & M Bank is stopping service as of August 1st. There are 17 users for online giving, only 7 are active. They will receive a letter stating online giving will cease August 1st, as well as we information regarding a new online giving system. Church Teams is a full service software system, including an email/text system to report to members of the church (to take the place of the One Call now system that was planned on being used in the future). There is a 30 day free trial. Roughly \$1,164 annual charge for this service. By going with any one of these three options, online giving most likely would increase by usage, it could modernize ways of the church. Pastor Erich is asking 4 committee members to research each of these companies and bring reports to the next meeting to help make a final decision on which company to go with.

•For the last 2 ½ weeks the church's email has been causing issues. The Karcher Group has been hosting our domain for free for several years. They have tried to troubleshoot for a while. They want to move our hosting place which may begin a monthly charge. As of now rtecexpress.net emails are working the best.

•Associate Pastor's Report:

a)Stephen Ministry – Nancy Rupp has agreed to serve as our 4th Stephen Leader, Conference is the first week of August. Further planning is on hold until the training is complete.

b)Youth Mission Trip -9 students and 3 chaperones attended, visited Hope Living Church and had a great educational experience. The youth worked hard and helped set up a 6 week summer camp for kids. Painting and projects were done around the church by our youth.

c)Fall Planning – Youth Ministries – Ryan and Devin Bernath have agreed to help with Senior High Sunday School using The Gospel Project for curriculum. SYF – Ryan Christman and Kim Hines will return as SYF leaders. Jenny Young will be joining in helping with this ministry. JYF – Eric and Sarah Nafziger, Steve and Kim Walker and Carrie Yoder will continue to help with that ministry. Looking into a fall retreat at Camp Palmer in November. 11
