## Sermon – “Order in the Assembly”

### Scripture – 1 Corinthians 14:26-40

#### Biblical Interpretation

1. Context of the passage must be considered and understood
2. What is the passage about? What comes before the passage? What comes after?
3. What is the broader context – what does the Bible as a whole say on the subject?
4. What is the author intending to teach, to say?

2 Timothy 2:15 – “Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a workman who does not need to be ashamed and who **correctly handles the word of truth.**”

1 Corinthians 1:10 – “I appeal to you, brothers, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree with one another so that there may be *no divisions among you* and that you may be *perfectly united in mind and thought.*”

1 Corinthians 14:40 – “But everything should be done in a *fitting and orderly way.*”

1 Corinthians 14:27-28 – “If anyone speaks in a tongue, two – or at the most three – should speak, one at a time, and someone must interpret. <sup>28</sup>If there is no interpreter, the speaker should keep quiet in the church and speak to himself and God.”

- Speaker of tongues to keep quiet under certain conditions – if there are more than three, and if there is no interpreter present

1 Corinthians 14:29-31 – “Two or three prophets should speak, and the others should weigh carefully what is said. <sup>30</sup>And if a revelation comes to someone who is sitting down, the first speaker should stop. <sup>31</sup>For you can all prophesy in turn so that everyone may be instructed and encouraged.”

- Speaker of prophesy to keep silent under certain conditions – if there are more than three, and if a revelation comes, the first should stop speaking.

1 Corinthians 14:33-35 – “As in all the congregations of the saints, <sup>34</sup>women should remain silent in the churches. They are not allowed to speak, but must be in submission, as the Law says. <sup>35</sup>If they want to inquire about something, they should ask their own husbands at home; for it is disgraceful for a woman to speak in the church.”

- Greek – “gyne”, “goo-nay” – can refer to either “women” or “wives”
- Context indicates it is “wives” – for they are to ask their husbands
- Context does not address unmarried women
- Context of 11:5 – “And every woman who prays or prophesies with her head uncovered dishonors her head...”

Genesis 2:18; Ephesians 5:21-33; Joel 2:28-32 and Acts 2:17-21


## Let's Talk About It - This Week in Our Children's and Youth Education

**LOGOS: Preschool/Kindergarten:** 1 Corinthians 12:12, 14-27, "God made my body and my eyes." This week we focused on how God made and makes all things, including us. Jesus shows us how to love one another while the Holy Spirit knits us together in our diversity just like parts of the body. Together we are the Body of Christ. **Fourth Grade:** This week we continued our study on confession, with our focus on the scripture verse I John 1:9. We solved a puzzle, wrote it down, and played a game to help learn it. The class was given the challenge to memorize it. If they can tell it to me from memory on Wednesday they will get an extra surprise. Go ahead, ask them to say it for you.

**Fifth Grade:** The 5th graders talked about putting their trust into GOD. We studied Joshua 1:9 - "Remember, I commanded you to be strong and brave. Don't be afraid, because the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go." Psalm 56:3 - "When I am afraid, I put my trust in you." We can't see God, but we know that he is there holding us up and supporting us.

**SHSS:** Our lesson comes from Genesis 25; looking at God's covenant promises being based on His faithfulness, not ours. God's unchanging nature is great news! He is the same yesterday, today and forever.
