Pastoral news

Though I've had a few previous surgeries in my life, my recent back surgery was by far the most involved and the most serious. A month before the surgery, a family member, with good intent, shared with me a concern they had learned about the surgeon scheduled to perform my operation. Because of that shared concern, I did further research on the surgeon I had previously vetted. I discovered there were a few people in the congregation who the surgeon had operated on, or he had operated upon a family member of theirs, and all was well with each case. With that reassurance, I awaited August 22nd.

With trust in the Lord and an assurance of His presence, Lynne and I arrived at the hospital and I went through the various steps of preparation. Finally, all prepped, I waited in a curtained off room, where Lynne soon rejoined me, though she wasn't alone when she came back to wait with me. Betsy, Tom and Dave appeared too. Betsy offered a prayer of trust and assurance, and my mind remained calm and peaceful as I thanked God, my wife and three of my friends for their presence.

As I was wheeled into the surgery room, prior to receiving any meds and still alert, the nurses asked me what music I wanted to listen too. I found that odd – I wasn't going to be listening for very long, was I? But their calm attentiveness was part of their routine, and that's pretty much the last thought I remembered until I awoke several hours later.

The next day, as I lay in bed and reflected on what God had done for me, I thanked Him for calmness, for assurance, for care, and mostly for His presence. Lynne read passages to me each day, and one that I reflected on was Hebrews 10:19-24: "Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the Most Holy Place by the blood of Jesus, by a new and living way opened for us through the curtain, that is, his body, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near to God with a sincere heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled to cleanse us from a guilty conscience and having our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds."

In full assurance of faith. Though there were momentary hours of discomfort, when no food tasted good, when no position was comfortable, when the hours of night were long and restless, scripture reminded me of God's presence, that my hope in Him needed to be unswerving.

In your own trials and times of discomfort, whether that be physical, emotional, mental or spiritual, or all four, may these words of Hebrews 10 spur you on. Know that the Spirit is with us, that we can trust in God's love and care, and that His plan for us will bring fruit and joy in His time. Continue to draw near to God, in love and faithfulness. Amen.



Preschool Corner- Now that there is a chill in the air, it's finally feeling like fall! Our "Weather Frog" is finally able to wear his warm hat and coat. With almost 5 weeks in October, we were busy!

The first week of the month we were learning all about apples. We learned about the parts of the apple, including the skin, stem, seeds, core and flesh. Everyone got to taste a Honeycrisp apple, and we talked about how sweet and crunchy it was. We sang "Here We Go Round the Apple Tree", "A-P-P-L-E" and "Way Up High in the Apple Tree". The Monday-Wednesday-Friday classes learned about "chromatography" when they colored on coffee filters with markers, then sprayed them with water to get a tie-dye effect. We made these into an apple shape to hang in a window. We made "apple pie" in the sensory table, with a combination of nutmeg, cloves, cinnamon, ginger, small imitation apples, spoons and pans. The classroom smelled SO good!

The second week of the month was all about Fire Safety, as we learned about "two ways out", "crawl low when it's time to go", and "stop, drop and roll". Some of the classroom activities included matching capital and lower case letters on 'flames' in the Writing Center, playing a roll and color Fire Safety dice game in the Math Center, and many children enjoyed "putting fires out" in the Sensory Table with squirt bottles, water, and foam flames. We ended the week with field trips to the Archbold Fire Station, where we learned SO much more! The older children even got to explore the Safety Trailer, where they learned about how to be safe at home.

The third week of the month was "Teddy Bear" week. We did fun activities with teddy bears, such as the action song, "Going on a Bear Hunt", and the children got to bring in their own favorite teddy bear on Thursday and Friday. The last two weeks of the month we celebrated Halloween, and also learned quite a bit about bats and spiders, including body parts of each, eating and sleeping habits, and about why God created these amazing creatures! Our Halloween parties were held on October 30th and 31st, with costumes and yummy treats! Our Bible verse for October was "Trust in the Lord with all your heart." Proverbs 3:5.

Back Bay Mission Trip

Due to changes in various health situations and work schedules of people signed up for the trip, the October trip to Biloxi was canceled, so we look ahead to the trip scheduled for February 9th through 16th.

The mission trip program at Back Bay Mission is focused on serving the poor and marginalized of the Mississippi Gulf Coast. They are also focused on making each week an opportunity for faith formation and learning. Among other things, volunteers have the opportunity to learn about poverty on the Mississippi Gulf Coast (and in their own community). Back Bay Mission is a national leader for mission trips in the United Church of Christ. They believe that providing these experiences is a benefit for participants, their congregations and communities, and the people of the Mississippi Gulf Coast. They hope that volunteer groups return home to tell others about their experience and lead the way in helping in their own community. The volunteer program at Back Bay Mission isn't just about serving the poor and marginalized. It's also about serving their volunteers! This is an opportunity for you to learn and grow while serving others. Goals of their program include:

- 1. Demonstrating how such an agency lives out the Christian faith by meeting the immediate needs of the people they serve and helping them grow towards long term sustainability.
- 2. Providing opportunities for increased self-understanding and personal growth for all participants.
- 3. Exposing participants to cultural patterns and value systems that may differ from their own, and provide an opportunity for dialogue about that experience.
- 4. Helping participants understand the ministry and commitments of Back Bay Mission.
- 5. Providing opportunities for meaningful service to others.

Volunteers from St. John's Christian Church will have opportunities to share in the work program (new home construction and home repair/renovation), the daily community soup kitchen, the weekly food pantry ministry and their daily assistance program with area homeless. Pastor Erich is working to coordinate leadership from past trip volunteers to increase the opportunities for people to engage in construction work, sharing in people related ministries, and both.

The team is now meeting every two weeks or so, and at their October 16th meeting their topic of discussion was worship. Good insight and thoughtful suggestions were shared amongst team members, pointing towards creating short term and long term goals. Some of the thoughts shared were:

- Asking youth to participate in leading various parts of our worship services
- Discerning whether our services are full of life and energy
- Asking people to meditatively read the printed prayers prior to praying them in unison
- Explaining some of our worship traditions, and parts of the services, so everyone gains a greater understanding of our reformed style of worship
- Speaking to people who have been missed, encouraging their attendance
- Finding balance in our worship music, with hymns and songs, old and new
- Team members are to be gathering comments from people of the congregation about what St. John's "needs" in regards to our worship of God. At their October 29th meeting, the team will work to write out a series of worship goals before moving on to the topic of Christian Education.

Nomination Process in Preparation for the Annual Election of Congregational Leadership

The Spiritual Council has entered into the nomination and election process of our congregation once again. The congregation can be in prayer over the offices of elder and deacon/deaconess, which have the following qualifications and terms:

Elder – Basic Qualifications:

- 1. An elder must be a member of the congregation of St. John's Christian Church, having been a member for at least six years.
- 2. An elder must be a Christian person who is earnestly devoted to living as a disciple of Jesus Christ and whose faith is evident in how they conduct themselves in thought, word and deed.
- 3. An elder must be an active participant in and supporter of the ministries of the church, and in full communion with the church's faith and beliefs.
- 4. An elder must be willing to perform the duties required by the office.

Deacon/Deaconess – Basic Qualifications:

- 1. A deacon/deaconess must be a member of the congregation of St. John's Christian Church, having been a member for at least three years.
- 2. A deacon/deaconess must be a Christian person who is earnestly devoted to living as a disciple of Jesus Christ and whose faith is evident in how they conduct themselves in thought, word and deed.
- 3. A deacon/deaconess must be an active participant in and supporter of the ministries of the church, and in full communion with the church's faith and beliefs.
- 4. A deacon/deaconess must be willing to perform the duties required by the office

Term of Office for Elder and Deacon/Deaconess:

- 1. Term of office is for three years
- 2. Term begins upon election at annual meeting, or appointment (in case of filling a vacancy)
- 3. Term ends at conclusion of annual meeting of the year the term expires.

These leadership offices are grounded in the biblical passages of 1 Timothy 3:1-15 and Titus 1:4-9.

Highlights of the October 15, 2018 Consistory Meeting

• Budget & Stewardship Committee – Joyce Kinsman – Financial Reports – In terms of the Operating Fund Expense Budget, year to date expenses are running lower than the expected nine month budget figures. In terms of overall income verses expenses, there is a \$9,000 deficit through September 30th. July, August and September giving has been higher than the monthly expenses for those three months, which is encouraging. Investment Meeting Report – Stocks and bonds are very diversified. Committee will meet on November 5th to work on the 2019 budget. Motion to approve the reports, Jeff Rutledge, 2nd the motion, Eric Nafziger. Motion approved.

- Capital Campaign Committee Jeff Rutledge Committee unanimously agreed to ask Consistory to take action to investigate a project to do now, so people can see something happen with the money currently raised, giving members something to look forward to, to possibly produce higher energy to raise more money, and take care of some pressing needs. Currently, restrooms, accessibility, kitchen and the sanctuary are the highest needs. Who takes initiative as to where we go next? The facility concept plans will have to be adjusted accordingly. Ann Fether moved to begin a 2018 Facility Committee, 2nd the motion Gloria Lauber.
- **Personnel Committee** Jeff Rutledge Annual reviews of Administrative Assistant and both Pastors. All chairmen on committee's need to fill out a form and return to Jeff by the end of the month.
- Mission Committee Betsy Ducey Planning a Mission Sunday on November 11th, with current campus ministries.
