Children's and Large Print Bulletins are available on a table in the sanctuary narthex.


Hearing Assistance is provided by our system for hearing aids with a "t" switch position.

This Week's Congregational Prayer:


Pray the following words from Psalm 17: Hear, O Lord, my righteous plea; listen to my cry. Give ear to my prayer – it does not rise from deceitful lips. ² May my vindication come from you; may your eyes see what is right. ³ Though you probe my heart and examine me at night, though you test me, you will find nothing; I have resolved that my mouth will not sin. ⁴ As for the deeds of men-- by the word of your lips I have kept myself from the ways of the violent. ⁵ My steps have held to your paths; my feet have not slipped. ⁶ I call on you, O God, for you will answer me; give ear to me and hear my prayer. ⁷ Show the wonder of your great love, you who save by your right hand, those who take refuge in you from their foes. ⁸ Keep me as the apple of your eye; hide me in the shadow of your wings ⁹ from the wicked who assail me, from my mortal enemies who surround me. ¹⁰ They close up their callous hearts, and their mouths speak with arrogance. ¹¹ They have tracked me down, they now surround me, with eyes alert, to throw me to the ground. ¹² They are like a lion hungry for prey, like a great lion crouching in cover. ¹³ Rise up, O Lord, confront them, bring them down; rescue me from the wicked by your sword. ¹⁴ O Lord, by your hand save me from such men, from men of this world whose reward is in this life. 



Let's Talk About It - This Week in Our Children's and Youth Education

LOGOS:

5 Yr Olds/Kindergarten: We learned about our amazing body of many parts and that together we are the Body of Christ. 1Corinthians 12:14-27.

Third Grade: We studied about Noah and the flood in Genesis 6-9. We talked about how people who love God obey Him, like Noah did.

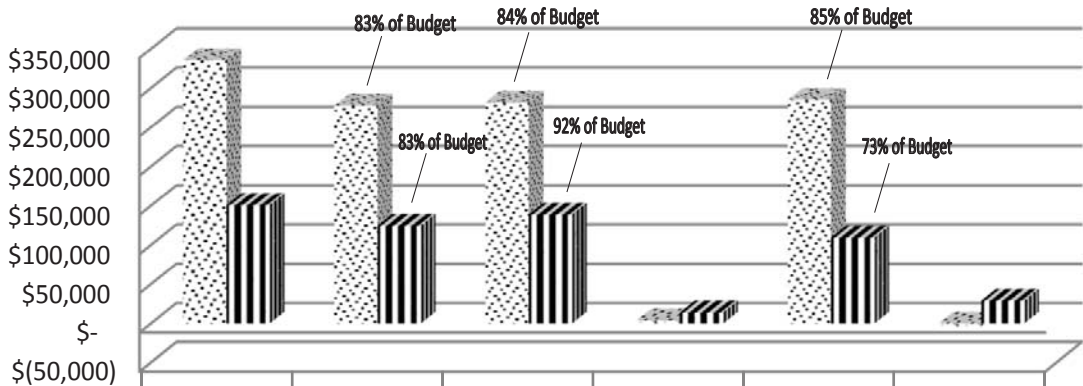
Fourth Grade: We focused this week on the importance of stories, and how they are a form of worship. Stories from the Bible are necessary in order to help us, and others, understand more about God.

Fifth Grade: Tonight we talked about how Halloween came to be, how things can grow into good and bad over time and discovering truth behind stories. We read scripture reflecting how goodness and stories can get twisted around to benefit others and help others as well.

SHSS: Our lesson comes from Genesis 22; knowing that God calls His people to trust Him completely. Christ's sacrifice on the cross was permanent, "once and for all" (Heb. 10:10,14) to take away sins.

How to Pray for Christian Leaders Serving in Campus Ministries:

Wisdom in Counseling – Students are often making big life decisions apart from parental guidance. They may come face to face with major consequences of sin or find themselves dealing with anxiety due to a variety of pressures. Campus ministry leaders need our prayers for wisdom in knowing how best to help students in a variety of situations.

The Heart of a Disciple Maker – College students are like sponges and desperate for someone to walk alongside them, helping point them to Jesus along the way. They crave the kind of life-on-life mentoring that can produce life-long disciples. Pray for leaders, that they will have hearts that long to make disciples who in turn go and produce more disciples.

Discernment to Be a Good Neighbor – Many secular campuses value diversity and the religious diversity that campus ministries and churches provide for students. Pray that campus ministry leaders will be wise in how they interact with the university community. May they be good neighbors who seek the best for the campus while also representing the truth of the gospel.

A Fruitful Harvest – Big life moments can lead to unprecedented openness to the gospel. College students are often making decisions about their faith apart from parents or other church influences. Pray that campus ministry leaders will be used mightily by God to reap a harvest of individuals ready to step into a new life with Christ.
