This Week's Congregational Prayer:

Most gracious God, I admit that it is difficult to be silent and to focus, for I find myself wanting too much and wanting to do too much, or longing to do what I used to be able to do. Yet, even as I confess this, I celebrate Advent, a season of preparation and anticipation. Thank you for Jesus, the Messiah, the light of the world, who shines through the darkness, giving us hope and peace. Here my prayer, Lord, as I offer up thanksgiving and petitions... Amen.

The Advent Wreath

The Advent wreath is created out of evergreens, symbolizing everlasting life in the midst of winter and death. The circle reminds us of God's unending love and the eternal life He makes possible. Advent candles are nestled in the evergreen wreath. There are varying traditions about the meanings of the Advent candles. In some churches, four purple candles, one for each week in Advent, are used with one white candle in the middle as the Christ candle. Other churches prefer three purple or blue candles with one candle being rose or pink, to represent joy. During each Sunday of the Advent season, the focus may be on one of the four virtues Jesus brings: hope, love, joy and peace. Others consider the lighting of the first candle to symbolize expectation, while the second symbolizes hope, the third joy and the fourth purity. The Christ candle is lit on Christmas Eve reminding Christians that Jesus is the light of the world. The order and exact wording vary among churches, but the wreath continually reminds us of whom we are called to be as followers of Jesus.

Traditionally at St. John's, the candles have symbolized the four virtues of Jesus – hope, love, joy and peace. This year, we are combing a few of the traditions stemming from a new resource used to guide our Advent worship. The four candles will be the candle of expectation, the candle of prophecy, the candle of hope, and the candle of joy.

December Mission-A-Month - Crossroad

Crossroad Child & Family Services was founded in 1883 as an orphanage by the German Reformed Church in the United States (one of the predecessor denominations to the UCC). They were founded as the Reformed Orphan's Home of Fort Wayne, Indiana to care for the "neediest of God's children." Ohio churches were very involved in the creation of the organization "way out in the Western Synod of the church" in Fort Wayne, Indiana!

Over the years their name changed and their services evolved as the needs of children changed. Today's Mission: "Crossroad creates promising futures for children in difficult circumstances by providing therapy, education and family support services." Crossroad is known throughout the Midwest as one of the largest providers of treatment for troubled children and their families.

There is a current list of needed items for Crossroad on the mission bulletin board just outside the church office and on the wall above the white mission box in the chapel narthex. Or monetary donations can be given through your regular offering envelopes or dropped off in the church office.


