Mother’s Room / Diaper Changing Station / Nursery Care

Stephen Ministry

Fear seems to knock on all our doors regularly. Fear may show up when you are lonely, asked to do something out of your comfort zone, receive a diagnosis you didn't want to hear, have thoughts of rejection, or any other distresses. We all need to remember that "fear" may be a big four-letter word, but "with" is even bigger. God says, "Fear not, for I am with you." (Isaiah 41:10) God is present all the time. We can climb into His lap at any time. He holds us when storms are brewing and our lives feel ready to fall apart. God holds, and He does not stop. Ever! Our fears may feel larger than life, but they are not larger than our all-sufficient God. God even provides people along our journey. Not only is God "with" us, so are those we meet on our faith walk. A Stephen Minister is such a person. A Stephen Minister holds your words and fears in confidence. God provides "withness" in the middle of our circumstances so we no longer need to fear. Don't journey alone. Ask about a Stephen Minister companion.

Scripture – Colossians 4:2-6

Sermon Title – “Lent: Prayer and Meditation”

Reading a second Bible version:

Colossians 4:2-6 (NLT) “Devote yourselves to prayer with an alert mind and a thankful heart. 3 Don't forget to pray for us, too, that God will give us many opportunities to preach about his secret plan -- that Christ is also for you Gentiles. That is why I am here in chains. 4 Pray that I will proclaim this message as clearly as I should. 5 Live wisely among those who are not Christians, and make the most of every opportunity. 6 Let your conversation be gracious and effective so that you will have the right answer for everyone.”

Jesus – a teacher of prayer:

Luke 3:21 “One day when the crowds were being baptized, Jesus himself was baptized. As he was praying, the heavens opened...”

Luke 6:12 “One day soon afterward Jesus went to a mountain to pray, and he prayed to God all night.”

Luke 11:1 “Once when Jesus had been out praying, one of his disciples came to him as he finished and said, “Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.””

Of note – to the entire church, personal devotional life; inward life of prayer – outward, busy life

- a) Devote – continue steadfastly – earnest adherence; persistence, fervor
- b) Watchful – keeping awake – constant spiritual alertness – watchful, active in prayer; not careless or mechanical, dull or heavy – Matt. 26:41, Mark 14:38, 1 Thess. 5:6, 1 Peter 5:8
- c) Thankful – the spirit in which prayers should be offered – zest
- d) Pray for us – imprisoned in Rome, not a selfish request – advancement of the Gospel
- e) God may open a door – seeking opportunities to witness
- f) Mystery of Christ – redemption in Christ – Col. 1:26, 2:2, Eph. 1:9, 3:1
- g) Outsiders – make the most of every opportunity – in an unbelieving society – how to live
- h) Conversation – grace, seasoned with salt – wise, tactful, cautious – purity, wholesome
- i) Know how to answer everyone – how to speak

- ✠ Africa – Tom & Megan – The Islands – serving since 2009, their children are Grace, Peter and David. Pray for the growth of faith in strength and numbers they've been recently witnessing, praying for the believers to live their faith consistently. - ✠ Dominican Republic – Jason & Becky Suon (Finn, Paisely, Stacia, Moses) & Daniel & Bethany Schrock (Luke & Grace) – Freedom International – the Suon's started serving in 2017 and the Schrock's in 2019. Pray for Leidy, a young child, who they've lost contact with, that God would reconnect them. Pray for sponsors for children of the school.
- ✠ India – Dr. Shobha Arole & Mr. Ravi Arole – CRHP Jamkhed – Shobha and Ravi are the children of the CRHP founders, who we've partnered with since 1967. Pray for surgery camps, and for patients, families, staff and volunteers during those camps.
