pastor's letter

Thoughts from Pastor Adam ...

Merry Christmas! One of my favorite Christmas memories over the years have been with bells. Whether it is the hand bell choir playing "Silent Night" on Christmas Eve or hearing "Carol of the Bells" on the radio, there is just something special about the



resounding ringing of the bells. Bells ring out loud and clear and their sound is carried great distances. In 1957, three large bells were set and placed up in the bell tower of the church building. They have been ringing faithfully for the past 66 years.

One of the tower bells stopped working and was recently repaired (big

thanks to Scott, Jim and Kelly!). While it was being fixed I took the opportunity to climb up there and look at these giant bells. I discovered that there are inscriptions on these bells and knowing more about the purpose of the bells is encouraging. On one side of the largest bell is a cross with the 1957 date. On the opposite side is found the text "TO THE GLORY OF GOD AND FOR THE CALLING OF THE FAITHFUL TO WORSHIP." The purpose of the bells is to ring out

loud for all to hear and to call all those to worship Him.

Recently we've been reading and studying Paul's letters to the Thessalonians. One characteristic



of the Thessalonians that he commends them for is their "ringing out." 1 Thessalonians 1:8 "The Lord's message rang out from you not only in Macedonia and Achaia— your faith in God has become known everywhere." The Thessalonians' faith and example was like a bell that was sounded and then continued to resound around the whole area. They handled persecutions and trials, hardships and sufferings with grace and faithfulness. They responded to conflict with love and forgiveness. They took the great message of Jesus Christ and shared it with those they knew and came into relationship with. Like the sound of the bells that can carry for miles, the faith of the Thessalonians carried throughout the whole region and even to us today.

This Christmas season gives us faithful believers opportunity to testify to the true meaning and message of the holiday. We have chances to "ring out" for Jesus by our examples, by our words and actions, by our faithfulness, by our priorities and by our choices. This begins in the internal quiet and relationship with Jesus. Walk with Mary and Joseph again this month. Take the journey to Bethlehem. Sit down with Jesus, the Emmanuel, God with us. Let Him ring in your soul. May His peace be upon you!

2013-2014 School Year:

We began the month of November with a unit on "Food/Nutrition." The children have been bringing in empty food boxes for several weeks, and we were able to use them in our pretend grocery store in the Dramatic Play area! Finding Light in the Darkness: Living With Depression

Feeling down from time to time is a normal part of life. But when emptiness and despair take hold and won't go away, it may be depression. More than just the temporary "blues," the lows of depression make it tough to function and enjoy life. Depression can make you feel helpless, hopeless, or empty and numb; but there's a lot you can do to change how you feel. With help and support, you can overcome depression and get your life back. The key to recovery is to start small and take things one day at a time. Feeling better takes time, but you can get there if you make positive choices for yourself each day and draw on the support of others.

To offer support for and awareness of depression, we are hosting three sessions on depression. Sarah Short, from the Central Mennonite congregation, will be leading these sessions on February 2nd, 9th and 16th. They will be held in the parish hall during the 9:15AM Sunday school hour.



The above data reveals the trend of operating throughout most of the year with a current budget deficit - our expenses out pacing our giving. The Consistory continues to monitor this situation, trusting in the blessing of God and knowing of the historical giving of the congregation. In seeking to understand the deficit this year, a key factor is the \$17,667.48 sabbatical expense. This doesn't take away the deficit, and isn't an excuse for the deficit, as the congregation approved this line item in this year's budget, but what it does show is that if the congregation continues to give at the same level as this year, 2014 should be okay in terms of stewardship. The \$19,010 defect at the end of October, minus the sabbatical expense, leaves a deficit of \$1,342.52. That's so much less! Without the sabbatical expense in 2014, the hope is that our giving will keep pace with our expenses throughout the year. Yet, the blessings of the sabbatical time are believed to yet be fully realized - much is yet to be revealed in the coming months as our pastors vision and seek God's direction for our congregation's ministries.

Additionally, November and December are the two months in which people's giving normally is at it's highest, so the hope and prayer is that the congregation glorifies God in their faithful stewardship to end the year with no deficit at all.
