

Let's Talk About It - This Week in Our Children's and Youth Education:

Faith Village: We continued the unit today entitled "Self-Control". The story is about Daniel and his friends and is found in Daniel 1:1-16. Daniel and his friends chose not to eat the rich food that everyone else was eating, and to follow God's laws instead. Have you ever had to choose to go against what everyone else was doing because you knew it was not what God wanted you to do? How did you feel?

LOGOS:

Preschool/Kindergarten: This week we focused on Mark 2:1-12. "Jesus and the four friends". After listening, we talked about how determined the men were to organize themselves to find a way to get the paralyzed man in front of Jesus. We then discussed qualities that make good friends. In closing, we made get-well cards for friends and family, and Cheerio bird feeders to care for our animal friends.

Third Grade: We learned in 1 Samuel 24 that David (although anointed to be King) did not forcefully take the Kingdom from King Saul, but let God work it out in His perfect timing. This taught David to follow God and we talked about how we can do the same in our lives.

Fourth Grade: This week in Logos we discussed communion and what a gift it is that Jesus gave to us at the Last Supper. We read from Luke 23 about the passover meal in the Upper Room, discussing the words Jesus spoke and also what each element of communion symbolizes for us.

JYF: A group of youth visited with the residents of the Group Home located just east of the church, making gifts bags of candy with them; while other youth played a game and then made gift bags of candy – to have one to enjoy and to have one to give away. Please pray for our youth – an unfortunate situation happened amongst some of the youth, which prompted a real lesson about the only rule of LOGOS – "Everyone is to treat everyone else as a Child of God. No one has the right to treat anyone as if they do not matter."


