- At 8:00 worship, communicants will be invited to come forward in groups; for anyone not wishing to come forward, the pastors will serve you in your pew after the groups have been served


July Mission-A-Month - Shepherd's Circle

Funds are forwarded to missionaries, agencies and ministries on a monthly, quarterly or annual basis. For example, funds are usually sent to local agencies on a monthly basis, to overseas agencies/missionaries on a quarterly basis, or annually to seasonal ministries like Operation Christmas Child or Christmas Cheer. There are transfer fees associated with overseas transactions, so sending quarterly lessens the frequency of those set fees.

I am scheduled to have back surgery on August 22nd. The surgery in the lumbar region will address degenerative disc and vertebrae issues. Following surgery I will need to wear a back brace for up to three months. I will be in the hospital from three to six days following surgery, then home for a recovery time of two to eight weeks. I will start physical therapy on September 17th, the week that I intend to start back in the office, so I'll be off work for about a month – at least that's my initial hope. The neurosurgeon reviewed everything with Lynne and I and we feel comfortable with the option of surgery to correct my back issues. I've already started working getting everything covered and accounted for during the month I will be out of the office. I would appreciate your continued prayers for a successful surgery and time of recovery."
