The Evangelical Association (EA)

What is the EA? The Evangelical Association of Reformed and Congregational Christian Churches is a growing, national voluntary association of churches, ministers, and believers networking together to further the cause of our Lord Jesus Christ. Recognition in this Association is fully compatible with the participation in other denominations and associations.

Vision - Revitalizing and reproducing healthy churches for Kingdom advancement.

Mission – The Evangelical Association networks congregations and individuals to encourage and equip one another for Biblical revitalization and reproduction of healthy churches.

Purpose – The purpose of this Association is to:

- Deepen and expand the fellowship of our clergy and churches.
- Help ministers and congregations discover new and creative ways to work together in partnership to advance the work of the Kingdom.
- Assist churches coming out of denominational structures as they seek to function as independent, autonomous congregations.
- Encourage our churches, clergy and laity to maintain a steadfast biblical witness, affirming Jesus as Lord in an era when many are pressuring Christians to compromise the truth.
- To support and promote the Scriptural principles of the autonomy of the local church and encourage a steadfast Biblical witness by our churches, our clergy and laity to our Lord, Jesus Christ.
- To assist churches in finding pastors.

In the mid 1990's, following an initial gathering of pastors and lay people in New Braunfels, Texas, it was decided to launch a new association to provide an orthodox, evangelical alternative for churches and clergy. In 1998, the Evangelical Association was incorporated with a handful of charter member churches and pastors. It has continued to grow ever since. In recent years, the Evangelical Association has become an important networking tool for congregations and clergy who share our faith, vision and values. Pastors, lay people and entire congregations now celebrate their affiliation with the E.A.R.C.C.C. as an important link to the wider church as they seek to serve our Lord and Savior in their local context.

Each year, the EA holds a convocation, gathering clergy and lay people together for encouragement and inspiration, equipping and strengthening. This year's theme is "Equip & Empower" – drawing upon Ephesians 4:12 – "To equip God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up."

There were 113 people registered for this year's convocation, though some were unable to attend at the last minute. People came from 18 states: Alabama, California, Connecticut, Florida, Hawaii, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Maryland, Michigan, Missouri, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Texas, West Virginia.

Second Generation Administrators of the Comprehensive Rural Health Project

It was in 1970 that St. John's began partnering with Dr. Raj and Dr. Maybelle Arole, who founded the Comprehensive Rural Health Project (CRHP) in rural Jamkhed, India. CRHP works among the rural poor and marginalized. Founded to bring healthcare to the poorest of the poor, CRHP has become an organization that empowers people and communities to eliminate injustices through integrated efforts in health and development. Pioneering a comprehensive approach to community-based primary healthcare (also known as the Jamkhed Model), CRHP has been a leader in public health and development in rural communities in India and around the world. Annually, CRHP provides services that directly impact 500,000 people in the state of Maharashtra. Since the opening of the Training Center in 1994, over 30,000 local and 3,000 international representatives from NGOs, governments and healthcare professionals have been trained in the CRHP approach.

Upon the death of their parents, Ravi Arole and Dr. Shoba Arole assumed oversight of all the administrative and medical duties of this Christian based ministry. During a visit in 2013, SJCC members learned first-hand that each day at CRHP begins with team devotions and prayer, and that the "comprehensive" approach certainly includes sharing the gospel with staff, patients and community members.
