Scripture – Revelation 2:1-7
Sermon Title – "Jesus Among the Lampstands"

The Book of Revelation

- The Revelation of Jesus Christ
- Chapter 2 letters (messages) to seven churches, represented by seven lampstands
- The seven stars are the angels (messengers) of the seven churches
- Jesus Christ walks among the seven lampstands symbolically meaning Jesus Christ is moving amongst the local churches
- The message contains divine knowledge of the church
- Words of praise Jesus speaks of their hard work and their perseverance, of not tolerating wickedness and falsehood
- Words addressing their present condition have forsaken (let go) their first love lost their inner devotion to Christ, the quality and intensity have waned
- A call to repentance if not, their "light bearing" could be removed (lost)
- A word of favor hated the practices of the Nicolaitions

- Revelation vision
- Jesus Christ is alive (Matthew 28:6)
- Jesus Christ is the head of the church (Ephesians 5:23)
- Jesus is amongst his churches today the Spirit of God is present
- Have we lost our love of Jesus Christ?
- Many people are fed up with the church and are walking away; as Christ is the head of the church, when people walk away from the church, they are walking away for Jesus
