Scripture Readings

Matthew 2:1-12

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem and asked, ²“Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star in the east and have come to worship him.” ³When King Herod heard this he was disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him. ⁴When he had called together all the people’s chief priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Christ was to be born. ⁵“In Bethlehem in Judea,” they replied, “for this is what the prophet has written: ⁶‘But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for out of you will come a ruler who will be the shepherd of my people Israel.’” ⁷Then Herod called the Magi secretly and found out from them the exact time the star had appeared. ⁸He sent them to Bethlehem and said, “Go and make a careful search for the child. As soon as you find him, report to me, so that I too may go and worship him.” ⁹After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had seen in the east went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. ¹⁰When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. ¹¹On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasurers and presented him with gifts of gold and of incense and of myrrh. ¹²And having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they returned to their country by another route.

Ephesians 3:1-13

For this reason I, Paul, the prisoner of Christ Jesus for the sake of you Gentiles — ²Surely you have heard about the administration of God’s grace that was given to me for you, ³that is, the mystery made known to me by revelation, as I have already written briefly. ⁴In reading this, then, you will be able to understand my insight into the mystery of Christ, ⁵which was not made known to men in other generations as it has now been revealed by the Spirit to God’s holy apostles and prophets. ⁶This mystery is that through the gospel the Gentiles are heirs together with Israel, members together of one body, and sharers together in the promise in Christ Jesus. ⁷I became a servant of this gospel by the gift of God’s grace given me through the working of his power. ⁸Although I am less than the least of all God’s people, this grace was given me: to preach to the Gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ, ⁹and to make plain to everyone the administration of this mystery, which for ages past was kept hidden in God, who created all things. ¹⁰His intent was that now, through the church, the manifold wisdom of God should be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly realms, ¹¹according to his eternal purpose that he accomplished in Christ Jesus our Lord. ¹²In him and through faith in him we may approach God with freedom and confidence. ¹³I ask you, therefore, not to be discouraged because of my sufferings for you, which are your glory.

Sermon Notes

Sermon "Revelation Without Boundaries"

Scriptures Ephesians 3:1-13



Adoration of the Magi from a 4th Century stone panel. Jesus is depicted as a young boy and the magi are not elaborately dressed, as they come to worship him.

Matthew informs us that the Magi were from the East, thus the three are not Jews, but Gentile - as they seek Jesus to worship him, they symbolically proclaim that Jesus is the Messiah of all peoples. Jesus Christ calls us to seek unity and not division. Can you see all people as children of God?

Verse 1 - "...I, Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus..." What does it mean to be a prisoner of Christ?

Verses 2-6 - words of a Jewish man, a Pharisee (Acts 23:6), a former persecutor of Christians - how is it possible that God called Paul as an apostle? How did the disciples come to accept him? How did they overcome their knowledge and fear of him?

Verses 7-11 - so many special phrases to consider:

"servant of this gospel"

"less than the least"

"to make plain" (no "ifs", "ands" or "buts)

"the manifold witness of God"

"gift of God's grace given me"

"the unsearchable riches of Christ"

"through the church"

Verse 12 - "In him and through faith in him we may approach God with freedom and confidence."

January Mission-A-Month: Emergency Cleanup Kits

Our January Mission-A-Month works in cooperation with Church World Service to provide Emergency Cleanup Buckets and Kits for families and communities affected by natural disasters such as tornadoes and flooding. Kits are filled with items like cleaning towels, heavy-duty gloves, sponges, laundry detergent, dish soap, and more. Donations can be made through the church office or through your weekly offering envelope.

Health and Safety Guidelines

We encourage everyone to abide by these hygiene and safety practices:

- ◆ Wear a facial covering when in the building, unless you meet one of the exemptions.
- ◆ Sanitize/wash hands frequently and cover coughs and sneezes.
