THE DREAM BEGAN IN 1960 IT BECAME A REALITY IN 1964 FAIRLAWN CONTINUES TO SERVE TODAY

A need was seen in 1960 for a home to support the needs of the elderly. Local church leaders discussed this need and began exploring how they could better serve the elderly of the community. Eleven area churches eventually banded together with each offering two designated members of their congregation to serve as the "founding fathers" of what is today Fairlawn Retirement Community. Some of these original churches are no longer in existence and some have changed names, but one thing has remained constant, care and support for seniors in our region. Over the years as Fairlawn grew, other churches joined in this important mission of care. Fairlawn has expanded from it's humble beginnings of a care center to a full service continuous care community. Fairlawn provides quality retirement and long-term care options and services rooted in Christian principles for residents in Archbold and our surrounding communities.

The original Fairlawn Haven Building held 52 beds and welcomed the it's first residents in 1964. Today, Fairlawn Haven Care Center houses 105 skilled nursing beds and employs over 175 people. In addition to the Care Center, the Fairlawn campus includes 24 rooms in West Haven Assisted Living, 153 duplexes and apartments for independent living, and 49 USDA subsidized apartments.



Wessage from the CEO Cristal Vincent,

What a wonderful opportunity to experience the campus first hand, meet residents and see how truly special the Fairlawn community is. We were excited to find a home in Archbold that we share with my father-in-lawn and little dog, Sadie. Mark is and ordained minister and currently serves 2 churches in the area. I recently joined the Archbold Rotary Club and look forward to getting more actively involved in the community. In our free time, Mark and I love to fish (you might spot us wading in the Maumee trying to catch some Walleye someday).

I look forward to meeting many of you in the coming year. Fairlawn is such an important part of this community and I want to hear your Fairlawn stories. The original Fairlawn building has endured multiple additions to support the growth and needed services for residents today. The Care Center with a total 105 beds also houses two specialized units within the Care Center. Rupp Rehab has 12 private rooms for short-stay visits due to a recent illness, injury or surgery and the Special Care Neighborhood is a secure, homelike setting that provides specialized care for up to 14 residents with dementia and Alzheimer's.

Inside the Care Center there is a beautiful and well equipped Therapy Gym with skilled occupational, speech and physical therapists onsite. Fairlawn is able to provides both inpatient and outpatient therapy services to residents on our campus and throughout the community.







West Haven Assisted Living offers 24 rooms for residents that need just "a little bit" of extra assistance. Residents are provided 3 meals a day, laundry and cleaning services, special activities and a list of personal care and health care services that are available as needed.

FAIRLAWN VILLAGE DUPLEXES, HAVEN APARTMENTS & WYSE COMMONS

Independent Seniors have made Fairlawn home for over 30 years. Fairlawn offers safety and security in private homes without the worries of maintenance, yard work or snow removal. Wyse Commons Health & Wellness Center provides a wonderful area to socialize, swim, exercise or enjoy group gatherings. Staff are available to provide additional services such as housekeeping, laundry and transportation upon request. Most units have 2 bedrooms and all homes include an emergency call system. Originally opened in 1985 utilizing life lease options, today residents can choose between a life lease or rental option. 
