#### Pastor's Column

St. John's Christian Church follows a congregational form of government, or polity. This means that the local congregation governs their own affairs. In keeping with congregational polity, authority is vested in the congregation as a whole. It recognizes the authority of the people in the congregation in making the decisions of the church. This is why St. John's holds an annual meeting, and holds special congregational meetings as needed. Every member of the congregation has equal voice and vote.

When issues are brought to the congregation for input and a vote, there is the reality of there being at least two sides to every issue. Which prompts comments and questions and answers leading up to the vote. And when a vote is taken, it results in majority and minority sides of the issue. Which is obviously a natural aspect of congregational polity.

Yet, when the voting results are announced, what needs to take place in the minds and hearts of the people on either side of the issue? Unity! The congregation needs to seek unity before, during and especially after any meetings and votes. Scriptures calls us to be in unity:

- Romans 15:5-6 "May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you a spirit of unity among yourselves as you follow Christ Jesus, so that with one heart and mouth you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ."
- Ephesians 4:3-6 "Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit just as you were called to one hope when you were called -- one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all."
- Colossians 3:14 "And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity."

In America, when two sides disagree on an issue, I've not seen much sense of unity in recent times. Instead of seeking to come together for the good of all, the response has been anger, hateful accusations, and a polarization of citizens.

The church needs to respond with unity, setting the example for our nation, being a beacon of light to a fractured world.

From the lyrics of a well-known song, "Let there be peace on earth, and let it begin with me" we should be singing, "Let there be unity on earth, and let it begin with me."

## Congregational News and Thank You's


#### St. John's:

#### **Administrative Assistant - Maternity Leave**

#### **Christian Camp Scholarship Program**

Parents will complete and turn into the church office a form for each child they are sending to a Christian camp. #### 2021 National Day of Prayer – May 6

Local churches are planning for a National Day of Prayer event for Thursday, May 6th, to be held at the pavilion in Ruihley Park. The theme of this year's event is "Lord Pour Out Your Love, Life and Liberty," stemming from 2 Corinthians 3:17. Pastor Erich is helping to coordinate and lead the event, and he invites and encourages everyone to gather for this time. The short service will consist of scripture readings and prayers.

#### **Pandemic Protocols**

As of April 21, the Ohio Department of Health, the Centers for Disease Control and local health departments are recommending even those that have been fully vaccinated and are two weeks past their second dose, still practice all the COVID precautions in public: wearing a mask, social distancing and washing hands.

SJCC leaders continue to monitor the pandemic recommendations, looking forward to the time when the mask and social distancing protocols are no longer in place. Until then, let us all keep praying for health, relief and perseverance.

#### Preschool Corner

It's so hard to believe that Preschool Graduation is right around the corner! But the weather has warmed up, and we have been able to get out and enjoy the playground during the past few weeks. We began talking about spring during the first week of April with our "Growing Things" theme. We talked about things that grow, including flowers, plants and animals. The older children did a life cycle sequence activity in the Art Area, and chose among grasshopper, bird, squirrel, turtle, frog, and fish. The younger children learned a song about identifying parts of a flower, to the tune of "The Wheels on the Bus". We continued with spring activities as we learned about "Bugs & Butterflies". We learned how many legs insects have, and talked about many types of bugs. We even had several bug and butterfly specimens in our Science Center to look at! The older children made their own 'bug jars', with fingerprint 'bugs', and the younger children made a caterpillar-butterfly project with cupcake papers! Other activities around the room included a shape-matching bee/flower activity at the Math Center and bug lacing cards at the Fine Motor Table. The third week of April we were "Down on the Farm". We learned about farm animals and how they are different from pets and zoo animals. We had farm animals and our large wooden barn out for the children to play with, and other activities included "Horse Bingo", "Tractor Memory Game", and horse stalls and horses to play with in the block area. During the following week, we learned about different modes of "Transportation", and played "Red Light, Green Light" in the gym. We also played a number recognition game with keys and dice in the Math Center, and included many types of "transportation" in the Block Area, such as airplanes, trucks, cars, racecars, buses and trains.

## Consistory

#### Results of the Special Congregational Meeting held on April 18, 2021

Results of the action taken on the three agenda items is as follows:

- 1. David Stuckey was elected as the elder to fill out a 21 month term.
- 2. With a vote of 95 yes votes and 19 no votes, the Consistory recommendation to remove the organ from the sanctuary was approved.
  - A) That news will be shared with the Facility Committee as they work to finalize plans for a pending facility project, which includes some renovation of the sanctuary.
  - B) Contact will be made with organ companies to explore best practices for removal, and to check on any potential ways it could be sent to another church for use.
- 3. With a vote of 91 yes votes and 19 no votes, approval was given to proceed with forming a search committee for the purpose of calling a Pastor of Music and Worship to serve St. John's Christian Church.
  - A) The members of the Consistory plan to come to the May 17th Consistory meeting with suggestions of people to ask to serve on the search committee. The Consistory will then proceed with the process of finalizing the search committee participants. Anyone that has an interest in serving on the search committee should contact any of the Consistory members.

#### **2021 Accounting Changes**

- 1. The Capital Improvement Fund/Budget has been closed out. The annual budget line items related to facility maintenance have been shifted to the Operating Budget. Those line items include: Boiler Maintenance and Repair, Carpet/Pew Cleaning, Parking Lot Maintenance, Tile Floor Maintenance and General Maintenance.
- 2. Several budget line items were shifted from the Mission Budget to the Operating Budget, as they have been redefined as ministry expenses. Budget line items in the Mission Budget are focused on benevolent projects missionaries and mission partners beyond the local congregation. Those line items include: Church Camp Scholarships, College Scholarships, Evangelical Association, Love Fund, St. John's Evangelism Outreach and WMTR Pause for Praise.

These shifts added \$34,200 to the Operating Budget, \$18,500 from Missions and \$15,700 from the former Capital Improvement Budget. The hope is that people will shift their donations accordingly. While all the same facility and ministry expenses will be incurred, they'll be accounted for from different accounts than before.

# May Mission-A-Month

**Cherry Street Mission Ministries** 



Cherry Street was founded on Biblical principals in 1947, and remains a Biblically based, Christ centered organization today. Their Spiritual Advocates consist of both staff and volunteers that lead Bible studies daily and mentor guests through their journey with Christ. Cherry Street has a Men's Division, Women's Division (Sparrow's Nest) and food services.

Each night, Cherry Street provides safe, free shelter for nearly 230 men and women who would otherwise sleep on the street or remain in an abusive situation. For some, it's the first night they've slept safely in a very long time.

Cherry Street is more than food, clothing and shelter. Their redemptive programming is built around one on one discipleship. They care more about who a person is, rather than what a person has become.

Cherry Street is the only organization in the region to offer 3 meals a day, 7 days a week, free of charge to anyone who needs them. Cherry Street gratefully accepts financial donations and gift-in-kind donations (anything donated that is not cash). #### Summer Mission Trip – June 13th – 18th

For the past several years, the trip participants have worked with the LaPorte County Habitat for Humanity (LCHFH) affiliate that is based in Michigan City, Indiana. However, for this summer, we've just received word that LCHFH has made the difficult decision not to build a home this summer. Various factors have played into that decision, including the rising cost of lumber and materials, which would increase the cost of the mortgage for the partner family, which could be above typical income levels.

We are exploring other options for a project during the same week!

#### **Plastic Grocery Bags**

We were informed that Archbold FISH Pantry has an over-abundant supply of plastic grocery bags; however, we heard that residents of the Fairlawn community continue to need plastic bags for their mat-making project. So, we once again set a blue tub under the coat rack across from the chapel to be a collection box for plastic bags.
