Sermon Notes

“Plug into the Source” - John 15:1-8

Inspiration for the Sermon – a devotional thought written by a then local high school student a few years ago – a God moment from an everyday, ordinary occurrence.

Social Media, like many things in life, has various negative qualities attached to it, but there are many positive aspects to these platforms of information and communication.

God speaks to us in ways that are obvious, in ways that are not-so obvious, and in ways that are startling – we are called to be observant and open to such moments.

The everyday, ordinary occurrence:

- ◆ On the team bus, coming home after a game
- ◆ Phone dies – no distractions – an urge to pray
- ◆ Following prayer time – asks a friend for a charger
- ◆ Friend provides a chrome book with a cord connected – plugs in the phone, awaits charge to be enough to power up the phone – looking at the chrome book connected to the phone by a cord – has a God moment – John 15:4

John 15:1-8 – A verse by verse picture/image study:

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. ²He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful.

³ You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you.

⁴ Remain in me, and I will remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me.

⁵ "I am the vine; you are the branches. If a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing.

⁶ If anyone does not remain in me, he is like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned.

⁷ If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be given you.

⁸ This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples.
