How would you respond to statements like this? How can you engage conversationally in a way that is not argumentative, but in a way that is compelling and winsome and points people to Jesus?



CONSISTORY

Annual Congregational Meeting Sunday – January 16th, 2022

As with years past, we'll follow a special schedule on this particular Sunday:

9:00am Confirmation, Faith Village and Sunday School

10:00am Worship Service - Sanctuary

11:15am Annual Meeting - Sanctuary and Zoom (information below)

12:30pm Annual Meeting Luncheon

Annual Meeting Information Packets will be available by Sunday, January 9th, both in print and digitally. This year's meeting will feature two significant items of business (further information will be available in the meeting packet):

- 1. Second Mile Fund Disbursement Proposal this endowment fund has grown to \$560,000 since the fund was first invested in 2004, starting with a capital balance of \$260,000. As a way of sharing further blessings with our mission partners, the Consistory is recommending that we keep one-half of the growth, \$130,000, in the invested endowment fund for a balance of \$260,000 plus \$130,000 equaling \$390,000; as well as recommending that one-half of the growth be distributed amongst our mission partners, at the guidance of the Mission Committee, over the course of 2022. In addition, the annual disbursement of the endowment fund earnings to the Mission Committee would be increased from the current \$6,000 per year to \$19,500 per year.
- 2. Search Committee Recommendation Consistory approved the recommendation of the Search Committee to enter into a contract with Shepherd Staff, a Christian church staffing firm, in the search for a Pastor of Music and Worship. Shepherd Staff would work through a five phase process with SJCC, at a total cost of \$17,000 a \$3,500 engagement fee and a flat cost of \$13,500, which is 30% of the midpoint of the salary range of the position.

The Nomination Committee, the Spiritual Council, continues to seek nominees for Congregational Secretary and Deacon/Deaconess.

Emergency Cleanup Buckets

For every \$75 given to SJCC's January Mission-A-Month, one kit will be supplied and kept in storage until needed. Monetary donations can be made by indicating "MAM" on line 11 of weekly offering envelopes, or by selecting "Give to Church World Service" on Breeze's online giving feature.

Supplies Included in Each Kit:

- One five-gallon bucket with re-sealable lid
- Four scouring pads
- Seven sponges, including one large
- One scrub brush
- Eighteen reusable, lightweight dry cleaning towels (e.g. Handi wipes)
- One 50 oz. or two 25 oz. bottle(s) of liquid laundry detergent
- One 16-28 oz. bottle of liquid disinfectant dish
- One 12-16 oz. bottle of household cleaner that can be mixed with water (no spray bottles)
- One package of 48-50 clothespins
- Clothesline, two 50 ft. or one 100 ft.
- Five dust masks
- Two pairs heavy-duty, waterproof dishwashing gloves (latex-free, non-surgical)
- One pair work gloves, cotton with leather palm or all leather
- ♦ 24-28 heavy duty or contractor type 30-45 gallon trash bags on a roll and removed from carton
- One 6-9 oz. bottle of non-aerosol insect repellent

2022 Trip to Biloxi, Mississippi to Serve with Back Bay Mission (BBM)

A week in service with Back Bay Mission provides a wonderful opportunity to live out the prophetic call of Micah 6:8 – "...to act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God." The week is a service learning opportunity that builds upon a time away from the normal routine of everyday life.
