#### Psalm 108:1-5 A song. A psalm of David.

My heart is steadfast, O God; I will sing and make music with all my soul. <sup>2</sup> Awake, harp and lyre! I will awaken the dawn. <sup>3</sup> I will praise you, O Lord, among the nations; I will sing of you among the peoples. <sup>4</sup> For great is your love, higher than the heavens; your faithfulness reaches to the skies. <sup>5</sup> Be exalted, O God, above the heavens, and let your glory be over all the earth.

#### Psalm 92:1-15 A psalm. A song. For the Sabbath day.

It is good to praise the Lord and make music to your name, O Most High, <sup>2</sup> to proclaim your love in the morning and your faithfulness at night, <sup>3</sup> to the music of the ten-stringed lyre and the melody of the harp. <sup>4</sup> For you make me glad by your deeds, O Lord; I sing for joy at the works of your hands. <sup>5</sup> How great are your works, O Lord, how profound your thoughts! <sup>6</sup> The senseless man does not know, fools do not understand, <sup>7</sup> that though the wicked spring up like grass and all evildoers flourish, they will be forever destroyed. <sup>8</sup> But you, O Lord, are exalted forever. <sup>9</sup> For surely your enemies, O Lord, surely your enemies will perish; all evildoers will be scattered. <sup>10</sup> You have exalted my horn like that of a wild ox; fine oils have been poured upon me. <sup>11</sup> My eyes have seen the defeat of my adversaries; my ears have heard the rout of my wicked foes. <sup>12</sup> The righteous will flourish like a palm tree, they will grow like a cedar of Lebanon; <sup>13</sup> planted in the house of the Lord, they will flourish in the courts of our God. <sup>14</sup> They will still bear fruit in old age, they will stay fresh and green, <sup>15</sup> proclaiming, "The Lord is upright; he is my Rock, and there is no wickedness in him."

## **CONGREGATIONAL PRAYER**

Why is it, O Lord, that when I look around me I see evildoers flourishing? Liars get away with things. Cheaters often don't get caught. Bullies continue to bully. Innocent bystanders get hurt. Righteous people get sick. The loudest voice gets attention. How? Why? What should be my response, Lord? Life can be so unfair! (Pause for some selfreflection) Forgive me, Lord, for forsaking your truth. The words of the psalmist remind me that the righteous will flourish in your courts. I pray for the power of your Spirit to keep my strong and courageous, that I would not be tempted by the world's glitter, for I want to be faithful to you, honoring you and glorifying you. Thank you, Lord, for Psalm 92. What a blessing. Amen.
