PASTOR'S COLUMN

The Season of Lent – a time for us to rededicate our love and commitment to the Lord Jesus Christ. A season to renew or create new patterns of Christian discipline in our lives. A time to give up things that distract us from our faithfulness to Jesus, that negatively affect our commitment to live as he has taught us to live. We have several weeks to reflect upon the sacrificial life of Jesus, who did what he taught us to do – he willingly laid down his live for his friends, for us.

Jesus' sacrificial death on the cross is the ultimate of all sacrifices, for in bearing the sins of the world upon his shoulders, he sacrificed himself that we would know the forgiveness of our sins. The glory and depth of love displayed through his self-less sacrifice speaks of God's love for his Creation. But the ultimate sacrifice is not the only sacrifice to consider in the life of Jesus.

I've always been intrigued by Matthew 8:20: "Jesus replied, "Foxes have dens and birds have nests, but the Son of Man has no place to lay his head." Jesus had no bed of his own, he had no pillow of his own that he laid his head on each night. He sacrificed his earthly comfort for the blessing of others. It was the cost of his ministry, others came first.

Earthly comfort. There are a few aspects of the mission trips to Biloxi, Mississippi, that force one to endure a lack of earthly comfort. While the church bus is a great way to travel as a group, the fifteen hour trip is a test of one's fortitude. The bus does not provide a very smooth ride, and every expansion joint and hole is felt. The bus can be either too hot or too cold. The seats are comfortable, but only for a few hours, and the bus does not provide a very quiet ride – the engine is loud, the side door doesn't seal completely which allows for a constant whistle of wind. Upon arrival in Biloxi, it's a wonderful feeling to be done with that first part of the trip, and then in a few hours you face the next challenge – sleeping in a dormitory with several other loudly snoring men! No one goes to bed at the same time, and no matter how quiet you try to be, there's always noise when the next person climbs into their bed. It's noisy, and sleep is easily interrupted throughout the night. Complaints about the bus ride and the dormitory sleeping are readily heard!

But you learn to put up with the discomfort, the challenges. They are small sacrifices to make in a week of service and fellowship. The blessings and rewards are far more educational and worthwhile. Putting up with any discomfort pales in comparison to the life Jesus led, and the life Jesus offers.

The next time you experience any sense of earthly discomfort, think of Jesus. When it's too cold or soon to be too hot outside, when the heat or the air conditioning isn't working just right, when you can't get comfortable in your own bed some night, think of Jesus. Think of the people in our communities who daily live in uncomfortable situations. Think, pray, respond, assist.

Sacrifice your comfort, physically and emotionally, and love as Jesus calls us to love. Give of yourself, to be a blessing to someone today (#516, "Make Me a Blessing"; red hymnal).

Pastor of Music and Worship Update - Special Congregational Meeting on April 10th

It was through discernment and the leading of the Holy Spirit that the Search Committee for the Pastor of Music and Worship recommended a candidate to the Consistory on Wednesday, March 2nd. The Consistory received and acted upon the committee's recommendation, and has extended a call to Ryan Volkman to be the Pastor of Music and Worship. Ryan excitedly accepted the call; therefore, we are calling a special congregational meeting scheduled for Sunday, April 10th.

Ryan grew up in Archbold, served in missionary work for several years in Slovakia and the Czech Republic (SJCC supported him in those years), and has been serving as the Family and Youth Pastor at Wall Brethren Church in Wall, Texas, since 2014. For the last four months, he has been the interim senior pastor at Wall Brethren. Ryan and his wife, Stanka, have two boys, Daniel (8) and Filip (4).

A detailed letter with full dates and times will be sent in the coming week. All will be invited to a welcome reception for Pastor Ryan and his family on the evening of Saturday, April 9th in the Fellowship Hall (exact time TBD). Pastor Ryan will then preach at both services of worship on the 10th. A congregational meeting will be convened following the 8:00AM service of worship, ballots will be cast, then the meeting will be closed and reopened following the 10:30AM service of worship. Habitat for Humanity Fulton County, Ohio


