PASTOR'S COLUMN

I was recently blessed by an impromptu visit from Paul De Vierville, son of Rev. Nathan Wierwill. Having served St. John's from 1947 to 1966, Rev. Wierwill was at St. John's during the construction of the present church building and had an indelible hand in the design and the symbolism throughout the building. Paul was traveling through the area and took some time to walk through the church, and I returned to the church in time to talk with him for a while. Based in Texas, Paul is an educator, business owner, and author. We had a good conversation about the stained glass windows of the Sanctuary and Chapel, and he shared memories from his childhood at the church, including when he and his brother helped clean the church for his father. Paul and I talked about the need for prayer and the ministry of the Christian Church in today's world. I believe Paul graduated from high school in 1964, so it's been about fifty-eight years since he lived in the church parsonage with his parents.

It was an enjoyable conversation and I spent some time reflecting on the history and legacy of St. John's, which is a full and rich history of faith and ministry. Occasionally, I read through some of the historical accounts and membership records of the congregation. I am always struck by the number of people I've met in serving this congregation as Christian educator and pastor.

As I thought about the church's past, while in the midst of planning for the future of our mission and ministry, the passage of Psalm 127 came to mind, specifically verses 1-2:

"Unless the Lord builds the house, its builders labor in vain. Unless the Lord watches over the city, the watchmen stand guard in vain.² In vain you rise early and stay up late, toiling for food to eat -- for he grants sleep to those he loves."

In early May, I attended a pastor's conference that was held at Parkside Church in Chagrin Falls, Ohio. Several thousand pastors were in attendance, and the plenary sessions and workshops were a wonderful time of education and encouragement. To be reminded that pastors cannot accomplish anything unless the Lord ordains our work was a good reminder for me in this present day and age. I don't know what Paul De Vierville took away from our short time together, but I know he left me with a good sense of the Lord building the church and ordaining the ministry and mission of the congregation.

I once again covet your prayers for our common work together. With one program year coming to a close, we have much to do in preparing for the next program year which will start at the end of August. Pray for Pastor Ryan in his beginning months of ministry with us. Pray for the Building Committee as they work to select an architect. Pray for our youth ministry, for capable and willing leadership. Pray for a VBS experience to happen this summer. Pray for good preparation in planning for Sunday school, Faith Village, Logos, and adult ministries. Pray for the leading and revelation of the Lord's guidance upon all aspects of our mission and ministry.

The Work Transition Program, offered through Northwest Ohio Educational Service Center and housed at Four County Career Center, promotes the development of employability skills, along with social/emotional, behavioral and daily living skills needed for success in both the workplace and in life.

Each Wednesday during the school year, students from the Work Transition program help with various projects around the church, including folding and labeling Visitors, cleaning toys in the nursery and preschool rooms, organizing and cleaning storage spaces, assisting with table setups, and general cleaning and sanitizing around the church. Highlights from the May 16, 2022 Consistory Meeting Minutes

Committee Reports

- 1. Building Committee Ryan Christman reported that the committee is working on finding an architect. They will also be working on creating an official RFP (Request for Proposal). Next meeting is June 1st.
- 2. Fellowship Committee Jon Lindsay shared that the youth breakfast and senior recognition will be Sunday, May 22nd.
- 3. Mission Committee Crissi Stuckey reported that the Jesse Tree was a successful project. Clarification of funds received will be made at the next meeting. The JJ Safehouse in Archbold is looking for a house mom.
- 4. Spiritual Council Erich Christman welcomed Pastor Ryan to Spiritual Council and Consistory. Pastor Ryan will begin planning the music for worship and is becoming involved in other aspects and activities of the church. Plans for children's and youth Summer Sunday School plans were discussed. The council reviewed the biblical basis to become a leader in the church, which fit well with the devotion for tonight.
- 5. Evangelism Karen Walker reported that the committee brainstormed ideas related to evangelism. They have one scheduled event on Aug 7, the Book Bag Bash will continue but may be renamed "Book Bag Splash Bash." The committee is working to rent the community pool for something new for this event. The goal is to have a summer, fall and Christmas event.
- 6. Property Committee Matt Hines shared that the team is working on a number of projects:
 1) Searching for part-time maintenance; 2) Increasing hot water in kitchen is being investigated and getting estimates. Harmony Harbor ceiling leak is being investigated. Carport locks are repaired. The team took a walk around the church to identify other potential projects.

Pastor's Report – Erich Christman

- 1. The Help Build Hope event was successful as the walls that were needed were built.
- 2. Pastor Erich attended the Basic's Conference, listened to several sermons and attended workshops, with one of interest titled, "Healthy Church Post Pandemic." Several pastors commented that giving in the church is still strong. That is the same here.
- 3. Jocelyn will be working on a SJCC "Swag" Shop, an online store to get t-shirts, etc.
- 4. Tires and window frame on the bus are fixed, and it goes for inspection on May 25.
- 5. Community Meals after May 17th, there are no volunteer groups signed up for the remainder of the summer. Matt put a sign-up sheet at the fire house to get volunteers from AFD. A second, and possibly third, meal team has been formed. The plan will be to see how June goes and then the group will reassess.
- 6. Storage Building Cleanout Life planning did a great job helping out. A dumpster was rented to purge some things that were in the building. Electronics are being taken care of appropriately.
- 7. Youth Ministry Leadership right now, the recommendation is to focus on Youth Ministry leadership. Pastor Erich passed out a "Youth Ministry Leadership" document that was reviewed and discussed. The position could be part-time or full-time position. Focus would be on middle school and older. However, it was noted, that it is important to begin building the relationships with younger children as well.

Once everyone was divided into nine crews, the carrying of lumber to each of the stations commenced and then the nailing began. By the end of the morning all the walls were completed, some of them were stood up for dedication and pictures, and then the walls were carried into the storage building.

Participants included people from St. John's, Habitat for Humanity, and the Archbold community. The Habitat for Humanity participants included the partner family who will own this finished home, and many of their relatives and friends.

Habitat for Humanity is grateful to St. John's for the donation of the materials and completed walls.

Summer Mission Trip – June 25 – July 1

An Airbnb has been rented for the four-night trip -a private home that sleeps eight to ten, so we can cook our own meals and enjoy a group atmosphere in the mornings and evenings. The home is only about 1.5 miles from the work site, so we'll be able to save travel time compared to previous years. That means more time to fellowship and work together!

The group will leave early Monday morning and drive directly to the work site, working until lunch on Friday, at which time we'll head back to Archbold.



Habitat for Humanity, Fulton County, Ohio (HFHFCO)

With the house walls framed and ready to be assembled, HFHFCO is working to get things started for their 2022 house build. All necessary building permits have been approved, the lot has been staked, and the excavator contractor and foundation contractor are working to fit HFHCO into their schedule. Once the foundation is in place, for both the home and the unattached garage, volunteers will be needed to frame the floor system, erect the walls, set the trusses and go from there.
