SCRIPTURE READINGS

Psalm 121 ¹ I lift up my eyes to the hills- where does my help come from? ² My help comes from the Lord, the Maker of heaven and earth. ³ He will not let your foot slip- he who watches over you will not slumber; ⁴ indeed, he who watches over Israel will neither slumber nor sleep. ⁵ The Lord watches over you- the Lord is your shade at your right hand; ⁶ the sun will not harm you by day, nor the moon by night. ⁷ The Lord will keep you from all harm - he will watch over your life; ⁸ the Lord will watch over your coming and going both now and forevermore.

Exodus 27:20-21 ²⁰ Command the Israelites to bring you clear oil of pressed olives for the light so that the lamps may be kept burning. ²¹ In the Tent of Meeting, outside the curtain that is in front of the Testimony, Aaron and his sons are to keep the lamps burning before the Lord from evening till morning. This is to be a lasting ordinance among the Israelites for the generations to come.

SERMON NOTES - "A PLACE OF ENCOUNTER"

Verses 20 and 21 follow the Lord's instructions for building the Tabernacle, the portable "tent" of worship for the Israelites during their years of wandering in the wilderness. Described as the "tent of meeting," the Tabernacle was known as a place for the people to meet with God. God was more than a deity to believe in: God was someone to meet with. When the Israelites worshipped in the Tabernacle, they were in a place of encounter. A lamp was always to be kept lit in the Tabernacle, reminding the people that God never sleeps and He never slips into darkness. God is awake, alert and approachable, always.

Christians should remember that our places of worship are places of encounter. The church building, like the Tabernacle, is a reminder of God's presence.

- ◆ Pressed olives - clear oil, burned with little or no smoke
- ◆ The Testimony, the Ark of the Covenant, containing the stone tablets bearing the Ten Commandments. The Testimony would have been in the Holy of Holies, with a curtain separating the Holy of Holies from the Holy Place, and the lamps would have been in the Holy Place, where only the priests were able to enter.
- ◆ Oil kept burning - symbol of the Holy Spirit - "The Eternal Flame" - eternal presence of the Holy Spirit
- ◆ From evening till morning
 - ◆ The imagery of Psalm 121 - "will neither slumber nor sleep," and "The Lord will watch over your coming and going, both now and forevermore."
- ◆ A place of encounter
