#### PASTOR'S COLUMN

Once again, as always it seems, the past month has flown by. The end of June was the summer mission trip in La Porte, Indiana... which was followed by a week of isolation for Lynne and I, so I worked from home that week and could make no pastoral visits... and then I was called into action as a camp counselor! Back in March, my daughter, Amy, the camp program director, had asked me to block out the week of July 10th on my calendar in case she was short a male counselor. It wasn't until ten days before camp that I learned I would be needed. So there were three weeks in a row I was out of the office, per se. And suddenly it was mid-July and the need to focus on the new program year, which is now scheduled to begin on Sunday, September 11th, with our second celebration of B.L.A.S.T. Sunday.

In last month's Visitor, I highlighted three priorities: pastoral visits, youth ministry, and Christian education ministries. I made some progress on each of these three, and the three remain the priorities for the month of August.

Beginning in August, the South Property Task Force will convene for their first meeting. The task force is a group of eight people who will strive to discern future purposes and plans of the vacant lot to the south of our parking lot. I look forward to the process of discernment, brainstorming and discussion that will ensue over the coming months.

I want to share that I am currently engaged in a pastor cohort of the EA (Evangelical Association). I meet once a month by Zoom with five other EA pastors to study and discuss church revitalization and renewal concepts and plans. The August session will be the fourth three-hour discussion the six of us will enjoy together. The reading materials on the assessment of a church's life have been helpful, and the shared discussions have been insightful. As the cohort sessions move along, I will be sharing information and ideas with both the Consistory and the Congregation as we seek to fulfill the mission of the church – Matthew 28:19-20: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

#### **CHRISTIAN EDUCATION & FELLOWSHIP**

Below is an overview of the ministries offered by SJCC, with many resuming active ministry following our 2nd annual celebration of B.L.A.S.T. (Believe, Learn And Seek Truth) Sunday on September 11th.

- Sunday Morning Ministries (9:15AM to 10:15AM)
  - Preschool Sunday School Class: Pre-kindergarten age children, beginning with four-year-olds. Our preschool-aged children are welcomed by teachers, Amy Baden and Mindy Gruenhagen. The class meets in the preschool classroom, located on the first floor on the east side of the hall.
  - Faith Village: Kindergarten through sixth grade children. Faith Village is our workshop-rotation model program. Children will gather in the second-floor room known as The Well for the opening gathering time and then will experience an interactive lesson, with the morning session ending with shepherd time (a small group wrap up of the morning). Kim M. Walker is the Faith Village coordinator and the teaching and shepherding roles are filled by a number of volunteers of the congregation.
  - Confirmation: Seventh and eighth-graders participate in a two-year program that explores the Bible and the Christian faith. Weekly classes are led by Pastor Erich with Pastor Ryan assisting as available. Confirmation meets in a newly redecorated second floor classroom.
  - Senior High Sunday School Class: Freshmen through seniors enjoy some light breakfast snacks and beverages and then explore a lesson taught by either Ryan & Devin Bernath or Jeff & Stacy Rutledge.
  - Connections Sunday School Class: One of our classes that welcomes adults of any age. Connections is coordinated by Bruce & Carrie Wooley, and several people in the class help teach engaging discussion based lessons from week to week. Connections meets in the Chapel.
  - Women's Sunday School Class: A group of women who discuss trending books of Christian study. Jan Martinez serves to coordinate the class, which meets in the first-floor room across from the Preschool Room.
  - B.A.S.I.C. Sunday School Class: One of our classes that welcomes adults of any age. Leadership of the Brothers And Sisters In Christ is shared by Jim Grieser and Linda Heer. The class meets in the first-floor Parlor and weekly discussions flow from the Discovery guide devotional booklet.
  - Junior Church: Geared towards four-year-olds through second grade. We are working to restart this once-a-month ministry that occurs during the 10:30AM service of worship. Children begin in worship in the sanctuary, and then are released to Junior Church following the morning children's message. Junior Church will gather in the Chapel.
  - Mission Band: Geared towards third through sixth grade children, we are working to restart this once a month ministry that occurs during the 10:30AM service of worship. Mission Band focuses on exploring the mission ministry of the congregation, as well as engaging the children in hands on mission efforts. Children begin in the sanctuary, and then are released to Mission Band following the morning children's message.
- Tuesday Bible Study: This weekly time of prayer, fellowship and study begins at 9:15AM and meets in the Fireside Room. Lessons are of that day's Discovery guide reading, with lessons led by either Pastor Erich or Pastor Ryan.
- Wednesday Evening Ministries
  - LOGOS: Starting on September 14th, a new year of this preschool (four-year-olds) through sixth grade will begin. Directed by Kim M. Walker, the two-hour weekly ministry includes the LOGOS meal, worship skills, and Bible study.
  - JYF: Starting on September 14th, Jen Grime, Nici Wyse and Carrie Yoder will welcome our sixth, seventh and eighth-graders to an active year of fellowship, faith lessons and fun. JYF youth are invited

- to share in the LOGOS meal at 6pm, with the evening JYF activities beginning at 6:45pm in the Fireside Room.
- Life Planning: Kim Hines and Karen Walker continue as coordinators of this mentoring ministry that pairs a high school youth with an adult of the congregation. LP will begin the year on September 14th, meeting in the Chapel.
- SYF: The new year will kick off on Wednesday, September 21st, meeting in the upstairs Youth Room. Pastor Erich will coordinate ministry once again, and continues searching for further adult leaders with creativity and enthusiasm.

# August Mission-A-Month Back Bay Mission

"Back Bay Mission has a simple mission: to strengthen neighborhoods, seek justice, and transform lives" (thebackbaymission.org, 2022). Back Bay serves communities on the Mississippi Gulf Coast through ministries like their education and empowerment programs and their housing rehabilitation program - all with a goal of transforming lives. St. John's has participated in several mission projects in coordination with Back Bay Mission in Biloxi, Mississippi over the years and continues to be one of our larger mission partners.





#### Habitat for Humanity of Fulton County, Ohio – 908 Zenobia Street Home Build

908 Zenobia Street is located in Wauseon, south off of County Road F / W. Linfoot Street

- Construction work days will begin on Friday, August 5th as the floor beam, joists and decking will be installed that day.
- The following Friday, August 12th, work will begin on the garage, with further work scheduled for the next day, Saturday, August 13th.
- Friday, August 19th, the goal is to set the pre-constructed wall panels that volunteers of SJCC helped frame back in May.
- Saturday, August 20th, the goal will be to set the trusses and lay the roof sheathing.

#### **Community Meals**

- This weekly time of food and fellowship began in January of 2011, initiated and coordinated by the Archbold Area Ministerial Association. The initial concept was formed by a pastor from Zion Mennonite Church who enlisted Pastor Erich to help coordinate the start up and first year of this new community ministry.
- St. John's has been a host site, in conjunction with Zion Mennonite Church prior to the pandemic, and continues to provide coordination of the meal calendar.
- Prior to the pandemic, weekly meal averages were 150.
- Since the meals resumed in September of 2021, weekly meal averages have been 80.
- Seven area churches and three organizations have provided the meals over the past year.
- ◆ SJCC provides two weekly crews one that sets up the tables and chairs, and sets the tables; and another crew helps host the meal (serving coffee, clearing tables, washing dishes, taking down tables and chairs, and occasionally serving food).
- SJCC provided about 1/3 of the meals over the past year, and in addition has served most of the summer meals.
- Additional volunteers to help with the Tuesday evening prep, serving and clean up are always needed! The crew currently serving has sort of made a small group ministry of it, a time of fellowship and service.
