PASTOR'S COLUMN

"Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, ⁴ who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves have received from God." 2 Corinthians 1:3-4

Lynne and I humbly share the troubles we are currently going through, as Lynne has been diagnosed with breast cancer. A biopsy came back as malignant, which set us on a course of appointments and further tests for Lynne. As of the day I type these words, we saw an oncologist for a second time on August 29th and learned that Lynne will go through sixteen weeks of chemo treatment. Once those treatments are concluded, then she will have surgery.

We first heard the biopsy results four weeks ago, so we've had time to process through the news in talking with each other and praying for God's guidance and healing. As we have shared this news with our family, friends, and SJCC elders, we have already been so blessed with prayer support and words of encouragement.

I speak of troubles, plural, for there are many different facets to the situation, much of which I have learned from church families who have previously walked, are currently walking, or continue to walk through the shadowy complex realm the reality of cancer brings to one's life.

In sharing the diagnosis with a particular friend and church leader, their reply included the following, which I consider to be so well on target with my faith and thoughts in this short time so far:

"Faith will maintain your hope and peace. But those quiet moments can be troublesome – contemplating what lies ahead for your loved one, your family, you. Sharing the situation with others is very emotional. Stating the facts makes it so real. We are planners and organizers. Even though we know "stuff happens" and can change plans – circumstances like this – not knowing what tomorrow will bring – takes it to an entirely different level."

I have one friend whose wife died as a result of cancer. I have one friend whose wife has battled through ovarian cancer the past few years, and health troubles for her persist. These two friends have already been a comfort to me, as Paul writes of in the above verses from 2 Corinthians, as they have received comfort from God.

Lynne has been assigned a navigator, a nurse who will assist us in navigating through appointments, procedures, insurance and whatever other steps and questions we will encounter. Lynne's assigned navigator knew who Lynne was, from Lynne's involvement with the Archbold Community Theater, so there was a comfort level both with the position and the person. I trust you can make a connection between this nurse navigator and our Navigator in life – God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We do not navigate alone, but God is always with us, guiding us through.

I pray that the peace and comfort of God is with you, as it is with me,

CHURCH CONSTITUTION SPOTLIGHT

A church constitution is a legal document that gives the church direction in ministry and administrative structure. The constitution documents what a church is, what it does and why it does it. Parts of a constitution include: purpose statement, doctrinal statement, membership requirements, leadership roles and responsibilities, and procedural and legal issues. Church leaders are looking to highlight specific areas of the constitution as part of the annual nomination and election process, so here is the first Constitution Spotlight:

SECTION I - NAME AND OBJECT

Article 1.

The name of this congregation shall be St. John's Christian Church of Archbold, Ohio. Article 2.

The object of this congregation shall be to provide its members with the stated preaching of the Word of God, the administration of the Sacraments, the facilities for public worship, and the exercise of Christian discipline; and to adopt and to carry out from time to time such measures as are in harmony with the spirit, teachings and customs of the Christian faith that shall promote the general interests of the Redeemer's Kingdom.

Highlights of the Consistory Meeting Minutes from August 15th

- 1. Committee Reports
 - a. Budget & Stewardship Betsy Redd
 - 1. All is in good order; Betsy asked about acct #7090, this year compared to last year; Erich will re search; Jim moved to approve, Jan seconded, motion carried
 - b. Evangelism Committee Book Bag Splash Bash Karen Walker
 - 1. All went well, though weather dictated not holding it at the pool
 - c. Fellowship Committee Jon Lindsay
 - 1. BLAST Chicken BBQ plans are coming together
 - d. Mission Committee Crissi Stuckey
 - 1. TGRM Truck will be present on 9/11, with guest speaker sharing in worship
 - e. Spiritual Council Erich Christman
 - 1. Discussed worship calendar; set service of installation of Pastor Ryan for 9/18 at the 10:30am service; will decrease 10:30am communion servers from 10 to 5 for the 10/2 service of communion, with additional servers and elements ready for any increase of worship attendees; continue to work on congregational education regarding the nomination process
- 2. Pastors Report Erich Christman
 - a. Community Meals through August, with AAMA input in early September Erich shared that some churches are getting more involved than in the past, and we'll see how the new year starts.
 - b. Youth Ministry Leadership volunteer leaders are in place, except for SYF
 - c. EA Cohort NCD Assessment survey discussed the 30 participants to take the survey, and chose to have Erich provide a list of people who fit criteria A, B and C on the list, and then the Consistory will randomize selection from there
 - d. Jocelyn Walker additional employment through an online entity seeking approval based on the staff policy manual Ryan moved to approve, Nici seconded, motion approved, with one abstention
 - e. BLAST Sunday September 11th reviewed committee involvement for the education fair
 - f. Confirmation Room Updates shared that two volunteers have designed furniture and decoration plans, with funds, under \$3,000, coming from CE budget items.
- 3. Old Business Items
 - a. DQ Land Purchase \$15,000 check received; Linda will check on covering closing costs, which was to be done by the buyer, per agreement, as we have a \$350 survey bill.
 - b. South Property Task Force first meeting was 8/10 and it was a good start
 - c. Church Safety Pages 17-18 good discussion, recognizing that we need to address this issue now; seeking leadership to get us started, initially through visitor and bulletin announcements.
