## PASTOR'S COLUMN

We are in the midst of the Season of Advent, the four weeks leading up to Christmas. Advent is a season of reflection and preparation: 1) reflecting on the deep meaning of the birth of Jesus Christ, the Messiah; and 2) preparing for the expected return of Christ in the Second Coming.

Our times of congregational worship feature scriptures, music and themes focused on these activities of reflection and preparation. For those who know Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, Advent is a blessed time to reflect and prepare, to enjoy daily devotionals and sing or listen to the many carols of Christmas.

I am currently engaged in a new endeavor to share the true meaning of Christ's birth, and his death and resurrection, with children. LifeWise Academy is a program with a vision "to positively impact students, schools and communities by providing a Bible-based, character-focused Released Time Religious Instruction program."

I first learned of LifeWise through a pastor colleague in the Evangelical Association. I was intrigued enough by his talking about LifeWise at one of our pastor's meetings, that I met him one day in May of 2021 to visit a LifeWise classroom in Payne, Ohio. It was the final day of LifeWise for that school year and I was truly blessed to watch and listen to the 25 elementary students recite from stories of the Bible as they reviewed their year. The pastor told me that at least half of the children did not attend any church activities.

After sharing LifeWise with the Archbold Area Ministerial Association (AAMA) in the fall of 2021, the AAMA spent the following months learning about the program and hosted a LifeWise representative at their October 2022 meeting. Since that meeting, work has been and continues to be done to raise community interest: a kick-off meeting was held and a steering committee was formed. The work of the steering committee is focused on presenting a packet of information to the Archbold Area Schools for their consideration in approving a LifeWise program to start at the beginning of the 2023-2024 school year.

LifeWise is a biblically-grounded program with a very organized team of staff and volunteers. Their work of preparation and publicity has been amazing to witness. Though I have stepped back from various ministries outside the congregation as Lynne undergoes treatment for breast cancer, I felt compelled to be a part of the LifeWise steering committee. Compelled due to the reality of God's direction in connecting me with LifeWise in the first place. Compelled due to the fact that once I expressed my interest to LifeWise, I received an email from Ron Ritticheir, a launch coach with LifeWise. I did some checking of my records, due to Ron's last name, as I had met him when I conducted the funeral services for both his father-in-law and his mother-in-law. Based on direction from the AAMA, we've been in contact with the superintendent of Archbold Schools as we lay the ground work in our area. As part of AAMA, there is a steering committee doing the same work in the Pettisville School district, too.

Preparations! A lengthy list of processes and steps, all for God's glory in sharing the good news of the gospel. In this season of reflection and preparation, I encourage you to explore LifeWise at lifewise.org and pray for the work of the local steering committee.

Once I realized that my God has something amazing planned for me, my view of my struggles changed. I have done my best to change my mindset to focus on the positive, not the negative. I want to say thank you to my Church family for your constant prayers, thoughts and cards. I appreciate everything you all have done for my family and I.

#### Family Movie Night "Under the Stars" - Sunday, December 11th


