

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Romans 5:1-8 – Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, ² through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand. And we rejoice in the hope of the glory of God. ³ Not only so, but we also rejoice in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; ⁴ perseverance, character; and character, hope. ⁵ And hope does not disappoint us, because God has poured out his love into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, whom he has given us. ⁶ You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. ⁷ Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous man, though for a good man someone might possibly dare to die. ⁸ But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

(8:00 Service) John 4:10-14 - Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water." ¹¹"Sir," the woman said, "you have nothing to draw with and the well is deep. Where can you get this living water? ¹²Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well and drank from it himself, as did also his sons and his flocks and herds?" ¹³Jesus answered, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, ¹⁴but whoever drinks the water I give him will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 - ¹³Brothers, we do not want you to be ignorant about those who fall asleep, or to grieve like the rest of men, who have no hope. ¹⁴We believe that Jesus died and rose again and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in him. ¹⁵According to the Lord's own word, we tell you that we who are still alive, who are left till the coming of the Lord, will certainly not precede those who have fallen asleep. ¹⁶For the Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. ¹⁷After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever. ¹⁸Therefore encourage each other with these words.

CONGREGATIONAL PRAYER

Dear Lord, I wait with eager anticipation for that day when You make everything perfect and deliver me from the work of the evil one. What a beautiful day that will be, to see Jesus face to face and be swept into His loving arms. Thank you for the great comfort found in the knowledge of Jesus' second coming. SERMON NOTES

Statement of Belief – The final coming of Jesus is a time when Christ will personally come again as savior and judge of the world.

- 1. At that time, there will be a bodily resurrection of the dead believers to eternal life with God and unbelievers to eternal judgment
- 2. Sin will be no more
- 3. Believers will live in fellowship with God forever

Points of Knowledge

- 1. Meaning of the Rapture an event where all who have put their trust in Christ, living and deceased, will suddenly be caught up from the earth and be joined with Christ in the air, and taken to heaven.
- 2. Rapture Latin translation from 1 Thessalonians 4:17 caught up, to catch up, carry away
- 3. Rapture and then the Return separated by a seven year tribulation
- 4. Rapture John 14:1-3, 1 Corinthians 15:50-57, 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 (a revelation to Paul by the word of the Lord)
- 5. Tribulation a seven-year period beginning immediately following the rapture. Evil will spread, natural devastation increases, antichrist will sit at the center, personifying Satan
- 6. Pre-Mid-Post Views
 - a. Pre-Tribulation Rapture caught up before seven year period
 - i. 1 Thessalonians 1:10
 - ii. 1 Thessalonians 4
 - iii. 2 Thessalonians 1:3-10
 - b. Mid-Tribulation Rapture caught up in the midst of the seven year period
 - c. Pre-Wrath Rapture caught up at some time in the second half of the seven
 - d. Post-Tribulation Rapture caught up at the end of the seven years
