#### SCRIPTURE READING

**Hebrews 13:15-16** Through Jesus, therefore, let us continually offer to God a sacrifice of praise -- the fruit of lips that confess his name. <sup>16</sup> And do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased.

Matthew 25:31-46 "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit on his throne in heavenly glory. <sup>32</sup> All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate the people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. <sup>33</sup> He will put the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. <sup>34</sup> "Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. <sup>35</sup> For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, <sup>36</sup> I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.' 37 "Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? <sup>38</sup> When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? <sup>39</sup> When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?' 40 "The King will reply, 'I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me.' 41 "Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you who are cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. <sup>42</sup> For I was hungry and you gave me nothing to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, 43 I was a stranger and you did not invite me in, I needed clothes and you did not clothe me, I was sick and in prison and you did not look after me.' 44 "They also will answer, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or needing clothes or sick or in prison, and did not help you?' <sup>45</sup> "He will reply, 'I tell you the truth, whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me.' 46 "Then they will go away to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life."

# LIFEWISE ACADEMY

LifeWise started classes on September 11th, transporting children from Archbold Elementary to the LifeWise classroom in the Archbold Evangelical Church building. Classes are held Monday through Friday, with four or five class sessions each day. LifeWise continues to seek adult volunteers to assist in the classroom.

Volunteers ride the bus to and from the school and take attendance, and they are in the class-room to assist the LifeWise teacher as needed. The plan is to have two volunteers in each class session. People can also volunteer to serve as a substitute. The daily schedule of classes is:

## MUSIC & WORSHIP MINISTRY

In this time of leadership transition in our music and worship ministries, church leadership is tending to the following aspects of ministry:

- Greeters we are looking for four people each Sunday to serve as greeters, two to be at the south entrance and two to be at the accessible entrance, from 10:00am to 10:30am. The hope is that the four people could serve all Sundays of a month, just as our ushers serve a month at a time.
- Song Leaders we are looking for a person to join in the monthly rotation of leading singing during our Sunday morning services of worship. Each song leader serves one Sunday a month, leading singing at both services of worship. If there is someone willing to sub in as a song leader on an as needed basis, that would be a blessing!
- Worship Leaders we are seeking two people to join in the rotation, serving one Sunday morning every two months, leading at both services of worship. Worship leaders share in leading prayers, reading scripture, offering and special readings.
- Lay Readers we have a few slots open for people of the congregation to read the morning sermon scripture – serving once a month, at either the 8am or 10:30am service.
- Children's Moment Leaders in the joy of sharing and teaching with children, we hope to add several volunteers to this special rotation so that a person would share once every two months. If you've listened to children's moments, you know what it is about!
