Nursery Care is offered during 10:30AM service for children ages four months through preschool across from the church office. Parents can register children for Nursery Care online at www.stjohnsarchbold.org/nursery or by scanning the QR code to the left before checking into the nursery for the first time. We also have a Mother's Room located outside of the sanctuary for nursing mothers and/or mothers with young infants and toddlers. Diaper changing stations are located in

both the Mother's Room and the Nursery. An usher will gladly direct you if needed!

SEARCH COMMITTEE: DISCOVERY WEEKEND SUMMARY

In contracting with Shepherd Staff, a church ministry staffing agency, the Search Committee was involved in a Discovery Weekend on September 29th – October 1st. Members of the committee met and hosted two staff from Shepherd Staff for dinner on Friday evening. Then the entire committee met for an hour with those two staff members on Saturday morning. The two staff members spent the rest of Saturday in one hour sessions with the following groups: present and past Consistory members, church staff, ministry volunteers, and parents of children and youth. On Sunday, the two staff members worshiped with us at the 10:30am service, then they had a second session with the Search Committee.

The purpose of the Discovery Weekend was for Shepherd Staff to gain insight and knowledge of SJCC in order to facilitate their work in our search process. They gathered information to help better understand the needs and desires of SJCC regarding this particular search. An initial report shared key points for our education and consideration:

- 1. We cannot look back at what once was, but must look to the future with what can be.
- 2. Expectations or hopes that this new pastor will bring in or bring back young adults are unrealistic. The ministry is in a rebuilding phase and current students are the next young adult ministry.
- 3. Take a look around and assess current resources. If Youth and Young Adults are highly valued then consider a space for them to have ownership of. Shepherd Staff noted the possibility of repurposing the storage building as a Youth / Young Adult center.
- 4. It will be difficult to find a candidate for this position due to the church's location rural area and the reality that the number of persons to choose from that want to work with youth and associate pastor level of ministry is very slim.

The Search Committee is very grateful for the twenty some individuals who spent part of their time sharing with Shepherd Staff. Your input is an important part of this process.

Shepherd Staff is currently preparing an opportunity profile of SJCC and will start communicating with prospective candidates. They will send the Search Committee progress reports in three to four weeks and will then have weekly zoom calls with the committee chair and co-chair.

One task the Search Committee is asking the congregation to assist with is in the area of housing. Do you know of places for rent or for sale? Do you know of homes or apartments that might be available for short term use? We don't know whether the new hire will be single, married or have a family, so we are exploring all potential options.

PASTOR ERICH: OUT OF TOWN

Pastor Erich and Lynne will be out of town early Friday through late Sunday, October 27th-29th. They will be traveling to Jordan, Minnesota, just an hour or so south of Minneapolis. One of Pastor Erich's sisters, Sarah, has asked him to conduct the funeral services for her husband, Bob, who died suddenly on September 27th. Sarah and Bob were separated for many years, and it has been 15 to 20 years since Pastor Erich and Lynne had contact with Bob, so they would appreciate prayers for wisdom and discernment in what to share with Sarah and their three adult sons in their time together next weekend.
