Psalm 23 The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not be in want. ² He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside quiet waters, ³ he restores my soul. He guides me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake. ⁴ Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me. ⁵ You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies. You anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. ⁶ Surely goodness and love will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever.

Luke 15:3-7 Then Jesus told them this parable: ⁴ "Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one of them. Does he not leave the ninety-nine in the open country and go after the lost sheep until he finds it? ⁵ And when he finds it, he joyfully puts it on his shoulders ⁶ and goes home. Then he calls his friends and neighbors together and says, 'Rejoice with me; I have found my lost sheep.' ⁷ I tell you that in the same way there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who do not need to repent.

SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING: DIRECTOR OF YOUTH & YOUNG ADULTS

It was earlier announced that the Search Committee recommended Jocelyn Walker as the Director of Youth and Young Adults. After scheduling a congregational meeting for the purpose of acting upon the calling of Jocelyn to this position, the Consistory wanted further discussion and so the called congregational meeting was postponed. The Consistory met on April 11th for that further discussion.

Resulting from their discussion on April 11th, the Consistory has scheduled a congregational meeting for Sunday, May 5th for the purpose of acting upon the same purpose – calling Jocelyn to this position.

Jocelyn was presented to the Search Committee by The Shephard Staff (TSS), which conducted a lengthy and thorough nationwide search. TSS conducted several interviews with Jocelyn and provided the committee with professional support during this time. Jocelyn has provided an extensive plan for the vision she has for this position and our youth and young adults that aligns with the faith, values, and hopes of the congregation.

The Consistory has called for one service at 10:00AM on May 5th, with the congregational meeting to follow the service. A Zoom link will be emailed within the next two weeks for those unable to attend in person, and an informational packet for the meeting will be available by April 21st. Please continue to be in prayer for Jocelyn and our congregation that we remain open to the leading of the Holy Spirit as we seek the Lord's will together.
