

#### Nursery Care/Mother's Room/Diaper Changing Stations



Nursery Care is offered during our 10:30AM service for children ages four months through preschool across from the church office. Parents can register children for Nursery Care online at www.stjohnsarchbold.org/nursery or by scanning the QR code to the left before checking into the nursery for the first time. We also have a Mother's Room located outside of the sanctuary for nursing mothers and/or mothers with young infants and toddlers. Diaper changing stations are located in

both the Mother's Room and the Nursery. An usher will gladly direct you if needed!

**Children's Busy Bags** are located in the sanctuary narthex for children ages one-year to third grade. Bags are marked by age (**Pink** = Ages 1-2; **Green** = Ages 3-5; **Yellow** = Grades K-3). #### SCRIPTURE READINGS

**2** Corinthians 4:13-15 It is written: "I believed; therefore I have spoken." With that same spirit of faith we also believe and therefore speak, <sup>14</sup> because we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus from the dead will also raise us with Jesus and present us with you in his presence. <sup>15</sup> All this is for your benefit, so that the grace that is reaching more and more people may cause thanksgiving to overflow to the glory of God.

**2 Timothy 3:1-9** But mark this: There will be terrible times in the last days. <sup>2</sup> People will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, boastful, proud, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, <sup>3</sup> without love, unforgiving, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not lovers of the good, <sup>4</sup> treacherous, rash, conceited, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God -- <sup>5</sup> having a form of godliness but denying its power. Have nothing to do with them. <sup>6</sup> They are the kind who worm their way into homes and gain control over weak-willed women, who are loaded down with sins and are swayed by all kinds of evil desires, <sup>7</sup> always learning but never able to acknowledge the truth. <sup>8</sup> Just as Jannes and Jambres opposed Moses, so also these men oppose the truth -- men of depraved minds, who, as far as the faith is concerned, are rejected. <sup>9</sup> But they will not get very far because, as in the case of those men, their folly will be clear to everyone.

#### SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING: DIRECTOR OF YOUTH & YOUNG ADULTS

The Consistory has called for a special congregational meeting on Sunday, May 5th, for the purpose of acting upon the recommendation of calling Jocelyn Walker as the Director of Youth and Young Adults here at St. John's Christian Church.

It was with joy and thanksgiving that the Search Committee recommended Jocelyn as the candidate for this new, full-time staff position. Jocelyn was presented to the Search Committee by The Shephard Staff (TSS), which has continued to conduct a lengthy and thorough nationwide search. TSS conducted several interviews with Jocelyn and provided the committee with professional support throughout the search process. Jocelyn has provided an extensive plan of the vision she has for ministry with our youth and young adults that aligns with the faith, values, and hopes of the congregation.

A hard copy of a congregational meeting packet is available on a table in the narthex and digital copies were mailed out (please contact the church office if you did not receive one via email and would like one). The packet shares key information: Jocelyn's resume, an overview of Jocelyn from TSS, information about the search process and about Jocelyn as a candidate that TSS shared with the search committee, the position job description, and a draft of a call agreement for this position.

Please be in prayer for guidance, wisdom and discernment as we all prepare for May 5th. A 40% quorum of the church's membership is needed to act upon the recommendation. With a membership of 394 as of March 18, 2025, a 40% quorum is 158 people, so we hope that the congregation responds with their presence for this important step in our church's ministry.

# Dive Into Bedtime Stories!

Each year, children at VBS raise money to help other children in need. This year, we've teamed with Villages in Partnership (VIP), an organization which strives to end the cycle of poverty in Malawi, Africa. VIP works with local development experts in Malawi to implement programs designed to simultaneously address the inter-connected web of root causes of extreme poverty, including inadequet education.

Most children in the villages walk 1+ hours to school each day. When they return home in the evening, they complete essential housework for the family before being able to do their homework. But, in villages without electricity and candles considered a nonessential item, they have no way to read or complete their homework after dark.

### Donations for Lanterns & Books

We will be collecting funds this year to purchase solar-powered lanterns and children's books, allowing the children in Malawi to finally read their own bedtime stories & continue their studies after dark.
