Nursery Care is offered during our 10:30AM service for children ages four months through preschool across from the church office. Parents can register children for Nursery Care online at www.stjohnsarchbold.org/nursery or by scanning the QR code to the left before checking into the nursery for the first time. We also have a Mother's Room located outside of the sanctuary for nursing mothers and/or mothers with young infants and toddlers. Diaper changing stations are located in

both the Mother's Room and the Nursery. An usher will gladly direct you if needed!

SCRIPTURE READINGS

John 15:4-5 Remain in me, and I will remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me. ⁵ "I am the vine; you are the branches. If a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. **9-10** "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love. ¹⁰ If you obey my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have obeyed my Father's commands and remain in his love.

Romans 12:1-3 Therefore, I urge you, brothers, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God I -- this is your spiritual act of worship. ² Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is -- his good, pleasing and perfect will. ³ For by the grace given me I say to every one of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the measure of faith God has given you.

Ephesians 2:1-10 As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins, ² in which you used to live when you followed the ways of this world and of the ruler of the kingdom of the air, the spirit who is now at work in those who are disobedient. ³ All of us also lived among them at one time, gratifying the cravings of our sinful nature and following its desires and thoughts. Like the rest, we were by nature objects of wrath. ⁴ But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, ⁵ made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions -- it is by grace you have been saved. ⁶ And God raised us up with Christ and seated us with him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus, ⁷ in order that in the coming ages he might show the incomparable riches of his grace, expressed in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. ⁸ For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith -- and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God -- ⁹ not by works, so that no one can boast. ¹⁰ For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

Thank you, God, for both the direction and the challenges you included in your Word. I know we all need the light of Jesus to show us the way to glorify you as we strive to be transformed so we can know your will. Thank you for your great love and richness of mercy as we stand against the devious patterns of the world. May all that we are and all that we do be in your name, for the blessing of sowing seeds of salvation as we strive to be salty for you. Guide us, O Lord. Amen.

SERMON NOTES: "SALT OF THE EARTH" (CHURCH DRIVING CULTURE)

Matthew 5:13 "You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled by men.

- Salt flavors food; and salt preserves food, stopping the rotting or spoiling process
- Salt was valuable in the first century, sometimes used to pay wages
- Christians are to flavor life, flavoring the lives of others with the gospel
- Christians are to help stop the spread of evil
- When something is wrong, we can speak up for what is right
- When something is right, we can support it
- Flavorless salt is thrown away, good for nothing
- Christians are valuable, a Christians life can make a difference

- ◆ To exalt the Lord, to glorify God
- ◆ To engage in ministry
- ◆ To evangelize the world
