We also have a Mother's Room located outside of the sanctuary for nursing mothers and/or mothers with young infants and toddlers. Diaper changing stations are located in

Members of the building committee met on July 30th with JDRM, the electrical engineer coordinating the work for the new electric service to the church, and some interested electrical contractors for a pre-bid meeting. The time was insightful and lined out the steps of the process. The first step is for the church to order the electrical distribution equipment, which comes with a 4 month to 9 month delivery timeframe, depending on which bid is accepted. It will be interesting to learn of other such equipment delivery dates. The positive aspect is that we were aware of possible lengthy delays on equipment, thus we met soon after congregational approval.

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Revelation 21:1-6 Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and there was no longer any sea. ² I saw the Holy City, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride beautifully dressed for her husband. ³ And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Now the dwelling of God is with men, and he will live with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God. ⁴ He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away." ⁵ He who was seated on the throne said, "I am making everything new!" Then he said, "Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true." ⁶ He said to me: "It is done. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End. To him who is thirsty I will give to drink without cost from the spring of the water of life.

John 1:1-5 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was with God in the beginning. ³ Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. ⁴ In him was life, and that life was the light of men. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood it.

John 10:22-30 Then came the Feast of Dedication at Jerusalem. It was winter, ²³ and Jesus was in the temple area walking in Solomon's Colonnade. ²⁴ The Jews gathered around him, saying, "How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Christ, tell us plainly." ²⁵ Jesus answered, "I did tell you, but you do not believe. The miracles I do in my Father's name speak for me, ²⁶ but you do not believe because you are not my sheep. ²⁷ My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. ²⁸ I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one can snatch them out of my hand. ²⁹ My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all; no one can snatch them out of my Father's hand. ³⁰ I and the Father are one."

John 14:1-6 "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God; trust also in me. ² In my Father's house are many rooms; if it were not so, I would have told you. I am going there to prepare a place for you. ³ And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am. ⁴ You know the way to the place where I am going." ⁵ Thomas said to him, "Lord, we don't know where you are going, so how can we know the way?" ⁶ Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.

John 20:30 - 31 Jesus did many other miraculous signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not recorded in this book. ³¹ But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.

SERMON NOTES: "IS JOHN 14:6 TRUE? ACCURATE?"

When using Google Maps to find a destination you can be given multiple ways to arrive at your journey's end. There's the "avoid highways" route, the "tolls required" option, or the most popular option, the "fastest route." Google Maps lets the driver be in charge, choosing their preferred way as they see fit.

Many Christians believe the route to heaven is like Google Maps – multiple paths to follow.

Do you have a biblical worldview? A pluralistic worldview?

- A worldview is the framework from which we view reality and make sense of life and the world.
- A biblical worldview is based on the infallible Word of God. When you believe the Bible is entirely true, then you allow it to be the foundation of everything you say and do.
- A religious pluralistic world view generally refers to the belief in two or more religious worldviews as being equally valid or acceptable, accepting multiple paths to God or gods

John 14:6 – "Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.""

Jesus didn't say he would show them the way or that he would make a path for them, he said that he himself is the way.

Matthew 7:13-14 – "Enter through the narrow gate. For wide is the gate and broad is the road that leads to destruction, and many enter through it. 14 But small is the gate and narrow the road that leads to life, and only a few find it."

Is it true that Jesus is the only way to salvation?

Exclusive – Jesus is the destination and the route

Jesus' prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane – "if it is possible, may this cup be taken from me. Yet not as I will, but as you will." Jesus was asking if there was any other way to save, redeem and bring people to the Father – there wasn't – God's will was and is that Jesus is the way, the only way.

KAJIADO CHILDREN'S HOME CHILD SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM

For less than \$1.65 a day, you can make a life-changing difference on the world stage. Sponsorships are \$50 per month, which cover a portion of their basic needs for survival. We allow no more than three sponsors for each child to encourage a personal relationship. We appreciate that some folks can't commit to a sponsorship. However, anyone can become a "We Care" recurring donor designating any amount you desire. Anything you can do is not only needed but much appreciated.

There are more than 100 children currently being supported through Kajiado Children's Home. Kenya Child Services helps to identify children who are most in need. In addition, KCH is a rescue center which provides temporary care while Child Services looks for the child's extended family. When they arrive, the children are afraid and often malnourished. Many have never had their own bed or their own plate of food. It is a time of transition as they discover a new world. The other children welcome them as they become "brothers and sisters" to these children. They are provided love and caring attention as they grow to consider KCH as their home.

Each child understands that his or her sponsor helps to provide for them. You can exchange email or letters to provide encouragement to your child. You can also visit your child on our annual visits to KCH. Your level of interaction is up to you. When we visit the children they often ask if we know their sponsors and ask about them. These are very loving and appreciative children. If you can help, we can assure you that your donation is being used well according to God's plan for these kids.
