

Nursery Care is offered during our 10:30AM service for children ages four months through preschool across from the church office. Parents can register children for Nursery Care online at www.stjohnsarchbold.org/nursery or by scanning the QR code to the left before checking into the nursery for the first time. We also have a Mother's Room located outside of the sanctuary for nursing mothers and/or mothers with young infants and toddlers. Diaper changing stations are located in

both the Mother's Room and the Nursery. An usher will gladly direct you if needed!

Children's Busy Bags are located in the sanctuary narthex for children ages one-year to third grade. Bags are marked by age (**Pink** = Ages 1-2; **Green** = Ages 3-5; **Yellow** = Grades K-3). SCRIPTURE READINGS

Psalm 23 – A Psalm of David – The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not be in want. ² He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside quiet waters, ³ he restores my soul. He guides me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake. ⁴ Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me. ⁵ You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies. You anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. ⁶ Surely goodness and love will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever.

Acts 2:40-47 – Peter addresses the crowd on the Day of Pentecost – With many other words he warned them; and he pleaded with them, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." ⁴¹ Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand were added to their number that day. ⁴² They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. ⁴³ Everyone was filled with awe, and many wonders and miraculous signs were done by the apostles. ⁴⁴ All the believers were together and had everything in common. ⁴⁵ Selling their possessions and goods, they gave to anyone as he had need. ⁴⁶ Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, ⁴⁷ praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

SERMON NOTES - "DEVOTED TO GOD"

Program Year Theme of "Building Up and Building Out"

- Acts 2:40-41 the church was growing through the acceptance of Peter's message of warning and pleading with them to "save yourselves from this corrupt generation."
- Acts 2:42-47 description about the early church in Jerusalem, a church that was devoted to the apostles' teaching, to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.
- The earliest days of the church at Jerusalem Luke's writing in the Book of Acts "helps readers feel the nature of what God was doing by his Spirit through the witness of the apostles." (Expositor's Bible Commentary, Vol. 9, page 288)

Acceptance of the message Peter preached

- Old Testament Prophecy Joel 2:28-32 & Old Testament History Psalm 16:8-11
- Jesus miracles, wonders and signs; Jesus crucifixion and resurrection
- The promised Holy Spirit; Cut to the heart
- Peter repent and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ
- Growth of acceptance and baptism

Devotion – foundation of their faith – the legacy of God's work – a distinct devotion

- Devotion steadfast, single-minded fidelity
- Learning learning from the apostles authoritative; about Jesus Christ
- Fellowship their gatherings were distinctive, set them apart
- Breaking of Bread the Lord's Supper / eating a meal together a time of joy, agape love, praise and thanksgiving
- Prayer conversing with God

Fruitful Times

- Awe, wonders, miraculous signs evidence of God's presence
- Together, in common spiritual unity caring for each other, caring for the needy
- The New Testament Church daily, ate together, glad and sincere, worship
