

Nursery Care is offered during our 10:30AM service for children ages four months through preschool in the second floor room labelled "Artisan's Tent." Parents can register children for Nursery Care online at www.stjohnsarchbold.org/nursery or by scanning the QR code to the left before checking into the nursery for the first time. We also have a Mother's Room located outside of the sanctuary for nursing mothers and/or mothers with young infants and toddlers. Diaper changing sta-

tions are located in both the Mother's Room and the Nursery. An usher will gladly direct you if needed!

SCRIPTURE READING

Psalm 29:1-2: Ascribe to the Lord, O mighty ones, ascribe to the Lord glory and strength.² Ascribe to the Lord the glory due his name; worship the Lord in the splendor of his holiness.

John 4:19-26: "Sir," the woman said, "I can see that you are a prophet. ²⁰ Our fathers worshiped on this mountain, but you Jews claim that the place where we must worship is in Jerusalem." ²¹ Jesus declared, "Believe me, woman, a time is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. ²² You Samaritans worship what you do not know; we worship what we do know, for salvation is from the Jews. ²³ Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks. ²⁴ God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in spirit and in truth." ²⁵ The woman said, "I know that Messiah" (called Christ) "is coming. BUILDING PROJECT STATUS REPORT AS OF FEBRUARY 13, 2025

- The excavation of the pit for the elevator shaft includes digging a 3' x 3' area even deeper for a sump pump pit, and that has evidently been some tough digging.
- The workers are preparing to set forms for the base and walls of the elevator shaft.
- Unfortunately, the contractor who was lined up to take care of the pew restoration needed to withdraw his contract due to personal health issues. Fortunately, a contractor that had submitted a bid, who had already been notified we went with another company, was willing to reconsider our project, and we are in the process of finalizing that contract so we can get on their work schedule.

The schedule of work for Phase One – New Restrooms and Elevator:

- The new restrooms should be ready for use by the end of March
- The elevator shaft and elevator installation will be worked on through August
- Ceiling and flooring in the parlor, nursery/preschool room and first floor hallway will be addressed from now through early May.

The schedule of work for Phase Two – Sanctuary

- We are now waiting to see if the pews will be removed the week of 4/21 (Easter is 4/20)
- Asbestos abatement to take place as soon as pews and carpet are removed
- Sanctuary work is to be completed by July 28
