Nursery Care is offered during our 10:30AM service for children ages four months through preschool in the second floor room labelled "Artisan's Tent." Parents can register children for Nursery Care online at www.stjohnsarchbold.org/nursery or by scanning the QR code to the left before checking into the nursery for the first time. We also have a Mother's Room located outside of the sanctuary for nursing mothers and/or mothers with young infants and toddlers. Diaper changing sta-

tions are located in both the Mother's Room and the Nursery. An usher will gladly direct you if needed!

SCRIPTURE READING

Psalm 66:16-20: Come and listen, all you who fear God; let me tell you what he has done for me. ¹⁷ I cried out to him with my mouth; his praise was on my tongue. ¹⁸ If I had cherished sin in my heart, the Lord would not have listened; ¹⁹ but God has surely listened and heard my voice in prayer. ²⁰ Praise be to God, who has not rejected my prayer or withheld his love from me!

Luke 14:25-35: Large crowds were traveling with Jesus, and turning to them he said: ²⁶ "If anyone comes to me and does not hate his father and mother, his wife and children, his brothers and sisters-- yes, even his own life-- he cannot be my disciple. ²⁷ And anyone who does not carry his cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. ²⁸ "Suppose one of you wants to build a tower. Will he not first sit down and estimate the cost to see if he has enough money to complete it? ²⁹ For if he lays the foundation and is not able to finish it, everyone who sees it will ridicule him, ³⁰ saying, 'This fellow began to build and was not able to finish.' ³¹ "Or suppose a king is about to go to war against another king. Will he not first sit down and consider whether he is able with ten thousand men to oppose the one coming against him with twenty thousand? ³² If he is not able, he will send a delegation while the other is still a long way off and will ask for terms of peace. ³⁴ "Salt is good, but if it loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? ³⁵ It is fit neither for the soil nor for the manure pile; it is thrown out. "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

MISSION-A-MONTH - FRIENDSHIP HOUSE

This two-story home located near downtown Archbold is designed to provide shelter for one or two individuals or family units at a time until they are able to become self-sufficient. The Friendship House is endorsed by the Archbold Area Ministerial Association and is coordinated by a volunteer board.

DIRECTOR OF MUSIC MINISTRY POSITION

The Consistory has determined to move forward with making the Director of Music Ministry position permanent from "interim" as suggested at the Annual Meeting in January. Is it true that in some ways, a person can look like a Christian?

What is your faith self-perception?

In Luke 14:25-35, Jesus makes what it means to be a Christian very clear What is a disciple?

A true follower of Jesus
In today's world, Disciple and Christian are synonymous

Jesus speaks to the people who are traveling with him
Casual followers or Committed followers
Casual – depending upon the cost not being too much
Committed – accepting the cost
Ask yourself: Which am I?

Really? Hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters?

Hate – figurative use – like the saying, "I slept like a log."

In this use, hate means to love something less than something else.

To love something less than we love Jesus. To love Jesus more than anything else.

"Carrying his cross"

Verse 27

The travelers and followers were familiar with this reference
The cross was a cruel form of punishment used by the Romans
The criminal was forced to carry his cross to the place of execution
The people knew that the person was saying "goodbye to everything"
No turning or coming back

Consider the cost involved – giving up everything – to be a Committed Christian

In our hearts, Jesus must come before our loved ones, self-interest, possessions, careers, hobbies, life goals, and even our very lives.

It can mean our physical self
It can mean our personal desires, interests and needs

BUILDING PROJECT STATUS REPORT AS OF FEBRUARY 27, 2025

- ◆ Those coins found in the organ console were worth some money about \$4 worth!
- ◆ The Mel Lanzer crew is scheduled to pour concrete for the elevator shaft footings and floor tomorrow, March 3rd. Then once they set the forms, they will pour the side walls. Once the foundation of the shaft is set, then the crew will open up the necessary hole in the floor of the second floor for the shaft. The metal framework for the shaft has been delivered.

The schedule of work for Phase One – New Restrooms and Elevator:

- ♦ The new restrooms should be ready for use by the end of March we haven't heard of a new schedule yet, but much has to happen before then.
- ♦ The elevator shaft and elevator installation will be worked on through August

The schedule of work for Phase Two – Sanctuary

- ♦ Waiting to see if the pews will be removed the week of April 21 (Easter is April 20)
- Asbestos abatement to take place as soon as pews and carpet are removed
- ♦ Sanctuary work is to be completed by July 28
