Nursery Care is offered during our 10:30AM service for children ages four months through preschool in the second floor room labelled "Artisan's Tent." Parents can register children for Nursery Care online at www.stjohnsarchbold.org/nursery or by scanning the QR code to the left before checking into the nursery for the first time. We also have a Mother's Room located outside of the sanctuary for nursing mothers and/or mothers with young infants and toddlers. Diaper changing sta-

tions are located in both the Mother's Room and the Nursery. An usher will gladly direct you if needed!

SCRIPTURE READING

Luke 1:68-69, 74-75 Praise be to the Lord, the God of Israel, because he has come and has redeemed his people. ⁶⁹ He has raised up a horn of salvation for us in the house of his servant David; ⁷⁴ to rescue us from the hand of our enemies, and to enable us to serve him without fear ⁷⁵ in holiness and righteousness before him all our days.

Luke 23:8-12 When Herod saw Jesus, he was greatly pleased, because for a long time he had been wanting to see him. From what he had heard about him, he hoped to see him perform some miracle. ⁹ He plied him with many questions, but Jesus gave him no answer. ¹⁰ The chief priests and the teachers of the law were standing there, vehemently accusing him. ¹¹ Then Herod and his soldiers ridiculed and mocked him. Dressing him in an elegant robe, they sent him back to Pilate. ¹² That day Herod and Pilate became friends -- before this they had been enemies.

Luke 23:26-31 As they led him away, they seized Simon from Cyrene, who was on his way in from the country, and put the cross on him and made him carry it behind Jesus. ²⁷ A large number of people followed him, including women who mourned and wailed for him. ²⁸ Jesus turned and said to them, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me; weep for yourselves and for your children. ²⁹ For the time will come when you will say, 'Blessed are the barren women, the wombs that never bore and the breasts that never nursed!' ³⁰ Then "'they will say to the mountains, "Fall on us!" and to the hills, "Cover us!"' ³¹ For if men do these things when the tree is green, what will happen when it is dry?

BUILDING PROJECT STATUS REPORT AS OF MARCH 20, 2025

- ♦ New Restrooms, Custodian Room, Elevator Shaft, Preschool Room
 - Metals studs are in place for the walls between the restrooms, which will serve as a pipe chase, and the metal studs are in place for the sink plumbing. Lots of work was done this past week by the plumbers and electricians in these areas.
 - ♦ The in-floor radiant heat lines to the second floor were cut off so supply and return lines could be removed in the tunnels to make room for new pipe runs.
 - ♦ The elevator shaft was backfilled and the area prepared for concrete repair.
 - Masons are scheduled to be on site soon to fill in former doorways and prepare new doorways.

New Electric Service

♦ Toledo Edison set the new pole on Wednesday and Creighton Electric has the directional bore from that pole towards the building scheduled for the first week of April.

The schedule of work for Phase One – New Restrooms and Elevator:

- The work on the new restrooms is behind schedule and we haven't heard of a new schedule yet.
- The elevator shaft and elevator installation will be worked on through August

The schedule of work for Phase Two – Sanctuary

- ♦ April 21st Sanctuary pew removal
- April 27th final worship services in the sanctuary until late July
- ♦ April 28th Sanctuary asbestos removal
- ♦ Sanctuary work to be completed by July 28th
