Nursery Care/Mother's Room/Diaper Changing Stations



Nursery Care is offered during our 10:30AM service for children ages four months through preschool in the second floor room labelled "Artisan's Tent." Parents can register children for Nursery Care online at www.stjohnsarchbold.org/nursery or by scanning the QR code to the left before checking into the nursery for the first time. We also have a Mother's Room located outside of the sanctuary for nursing mothers and/or mothers with young infants and toddlers. Diaper changing sta-

tions are located in both the Mother's Room and the Nursery. An usher will gladly direct you if needed!

SCRIPTURE READING

1 Kings 8:22-24 Then Solomon stood before the altar of the Lord in front of the whole assembly of Israel, spread out his hands toward heaven ²³ and said: "O Lord, God of Israel, there is no God like you in heaven above or on earth below -- you who keep your covenant of love with your servants who continue wholeheartedly in your way. ²⁴ You have kept your promise to your servant David my father; with your mouth you have promised and with your hand you have fulfilled it -- as it is today.

MISSION-A-MONTH - FRIENDSHIP HOUSE

This two-story home is designed to provide shelter and a fresh start in life for one or two individuals or family units until they are able to become self-sufficient. The Friendship House is endorsed by the Archbold Area Ministerial Association and is coordinated by a volunteer board.

A year long search for a house mom or a house couple continues to come up empty, but the board is still searching! The person(s) in this important role would interact with house guests and coordinate evening meals, with the guests helping with cooking and cleanup. The house parent(s) would be at the house from supper time until morning, with flexibility to enjoy area evening activities. Guests sleep in upstairs bedrooms and relax in the first floor living room and dining area. The house parent(s) would stay in a first floor room — a large bedroom, with room for a seating area, and a private bath.

SERMON NOTES - "A NEWFOUND FRIEND"

Three crosses, three men:

- ♦ Matthew 27:38 and Mark 15:27 two robbers, one on his right, one on his left
- ◆ Luke 23:33 criminals, one on his right, one on his left
- ♦ John 19:18 two others, one on each side, Jesus in the middle

Two robbers/criminals/others, different accounts:

- ♦ Matthew 27:44 and Mark 15:32 like the crowd, they also heaped insults on him
- ◆ Luke 23:39 one criminal hurled insults at him, one did not
 - ♦ One criminal insulted Jesus
 - Mocked and scorned Jesus, reasoned if Jesus were the Messiah, he should save himself, and those crucified with him
 - ♦ One criminal rebuked the other criminal, called out to Jesus (change of heart?)
 - Feared God (respect)
 - All three under same sentence, two punished justly, deeds deserved
 - Knew his own sin
 - Knew Jesus had done nothing wrong
 - Said to Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom
 - * Jesus got the criminal's attention, believed Jesus was who he said he was
 - * Believed the promise of everlasting life
 - Response of Jesus truth, today, paradise (with Jesus)
 - One criminal claimed salvation through Jesus
 - One "deathbed" conversion in the Bible so no one would despair, but only one, so that no one would presume

Paradise:

- ♦ A Persian word, meaning garden or park; Genesis 2:8 (garden of Eden), Isaiah 51:3
- Not torment
- Glory to the grace of God, not human merit
- Criminal thinking of the future, Jesus said today
- Criminal to be remembered, Jesus said you will be with me
- ◆ Criminal looked for a kingdom, Jesus promised paradise

BUILDING PROJECT STATUS REPORT AS OF MARCH 27, 2025

- ♦ New Restrooms, Custodian Room, Elevator Shaft, Preschool Room
 - Masons blocked up an original doorway that will not be needed and filled in blocks around edges of two new doorways.
 - Water and drain line plumbing was to be tested and inspected on Friday.
 - ♦ Concrete floor around elevator shaft should be poured Monday or Tuesday.
 - Crews will be here this week to construct the bulkheads in the restroom ceilings to conceal pipe lines and exhaust lines.
- New Electric Service
 - Creighton Electric has the directional boring for underground conduit scheduled for this week.

The schedule of work for Phase One – New Restrooms and Elevator:

- The work on the new restrooms is behind schedule and we haven't heard of a new schedule yet.
- The elevator shaft and elevator installation will be worked on through August.

The schedule of work for Phase Two – Sanctuary

- April 21st Sanctuary pew removal.
- ◆ April 27th Final worship services in the sanctuary until late July for seating, we will use the 84 new chapel chairs, the 36 new sanctuary chairs, and the 36 unity pews that used to be in the chapel
- April 28th Sanctuary asbestos removal.
- Sanctuary work is to be completed by July 28th.
